Some background (very little to no spoilers):

Ashlyn is your average high school student living in Ohio. She has a crazy "bestie" friend and another great guy friend that loves her, although she does not reciprocate the feelings. Approaching Christmas, all was well, she was planning a trip to visit Ireland with her father...

And then the book starts with the death of her father. The callousness of the paramedics, and her grief cause her to do a seemingly impossible act - throwing the paramedic against the car like she was an action hero. This was just the tip of the iceberg for unusual things that seemed to begin happening... Her "Memaw", which had during her previous 16 years seemed to treat her with a cold distance, suddenly seems to be trying to reach out to her, to talk to her. Determined to make the most out of her trip to Ireland, she talks her mother into letting her go with her crazy "bestie" that Memaw does not seem to like at all...

Almost immediately upon arriving in Ireland, her "bestie" Jaime seems to have a polar shift in her attitude. Being surrounded by cousins and their friends, and meeting the handsome Liam starts to bring back some measure of warmth to her heart after loosing her father. Just when she thought things were turning around, meeting a cute boy that she actually feels attracted to, and seems to like her back, she overhears a conversation that leads her to believe she is just an inconvenience that must be babysat. So she and Jaime head off for some tourist sightseeing in Cork. Little did she know that all the fairy stories her grandmother told her growing up, and even Liam told her about his "stolen" little brother were true.....

This was a really good, refreshing YA novel. The characters are well written, and youthful without the whiny overtones that can turn me away from many YA books. There were innocent youthful romantic feelings, without any worry of a book filled with sex-crazed teenagers. There is still teenage drama, surprising more action than I expected, and Ashlyn turn out to be a much stronger and unique character compared to when the story begins. These faerie, changelings, and other creatures are **not** the happy-go-lucky, wish-granting, winged creatures that you may be familiar with from other stories. They are dark, and ruthless, and "other". While there does seem to be a dividing line between the "good" fae and "bad" fae... that line proves to be many shades of grey- murky and ill-defined. Even the "good" guys are still not human, and don't think like human. Do not expect Tinkerbell when reading this.

I am really looking forward to the next book in the series. It really is a good story, although one of the few complaints I have is there were many "future" plot turns that you can see coming a mile away. It wasn't badly written, but there were fewer surprises than I was hoping for. For anyone that love fae stories, and doesn't mind YA, I would highly recommend this book. I was pleased that I was given an opportunity to read it, and will most definitely read Traitor when it comes out...

My rating is not quite 3 stars, but I've decided to round up. First let me say that this story is very compelling. It's hard to put down as you must know what happens next. That said, it has a few problems. The fae lore is confusing, though very interesting. For those who are fascinated with the fae, it's a different, intriguing take on them. But like I said, it's confusing. And the thing with the chairs was weird, throwing me out of the story a bit - they just didn't fit at all. The love story was well done, though their connection happened too quickly. Also, the grieving and avenging of Ashlyn's father should have been a major part of the story. But the thing that bothered me the most was that the (inevitable) break-up lasted three weeks. At most it should have been three days. His mother should have stepped up to the plate and explained everything immediately. It was just unrealistic. I had a few other, smaller issues as well. But, like I said, the story is compelling. The author writes well and knows how to hook her readers. With more time and editing this could have been an amazing book. One trick another author uses is to read her work out loud to herself. She catches a lot of problems that way. I know this author is in the process of writing the sequel, so I hope she takes what I say into consideration. My critique is well-meant. Her talent is obvious, it just needs to be further honed.

This book opens up to a sad & chilling (quite literally) scene. It's days before Christmas, and Ashlyn McVean's father has just been pulled out of a frozen lake. Unfortunately though, it wasn't soon enough to save his life. Ashlyn, her brother Chris, their mother, along with with Memaw (aka Emily, the grandmother) now have to attempt to pick up the pieces and move on.

Pretty much immediately following the death of her father, Ashlyn begins to experience oddities that truly have no logical explanation. Ashlyn soon realizes she isn't quite 'normal'. Could the Irish fairy tales Memaw has been telling her since childhood have some *hint* of truth behind them?

Ashlyn decides that taking the trip her father had planned for her is the best thing to do. So, along with her best friend, she takes a trip to her grandmother's homeland of Ireland. She is there to meet extended family, learn more about her heritage, and of course just *try* to have a good time while attempting to deal with the sorrow of losing her father. While there, Ashlyn learns the real reasons behind the strange things happening to her - she's a rare being called a Bridger. Sort of faerie, sort of human, and something else completely.

A multitude of secrets pour out during her visit. Nothing in her life was or is how it's always seemed. Who and what is she supposed to trust?
