I love sports themed romances, so when I read the synopsis, I was immediately drawn to this book. The premise for the story is great and I did enjoy it. I liked both Jessa and Garrett's characters, especially Garrett. The romance/sex was hot and steamy, and is definitely not something for those under 18. While the romance was hot, it was the primary focus of the book for about the first two-thirds, and though the book is a light read, it got kind of redundant and I became a little bored at that point, wanting more angst and actual baseball-centered aspects of the story. About two-thirds in though, that part of the story picked up and became much more interesting, which I was glad about, as Garrett and Jessa dealt not only with the professional aspect of their relationship, but Jessa also had to deal with some issues with her father that had shaped the way she thought of herself, and both of them had to come to terms with the way they felt about each other and what that meant in the long run. I enjoyed the interaction with the secondary characters in the book, especially Garrett's friend and teammate Tyler. I was pleased with the way the story ended also. Spring Training was a light read that I enjoyed, especially once the story line picked up in the latter portion of the book, adding that much needing aspect that kept your interest and made the book about more than just repeated sexual encounters, and I was glad I kept reading until I got to that point.
