Bo Stern's account of the war declared on her family the day after she celebrated her forty-fifth birthday demands to be read cover-to-cover, then slowly savored in weeks to come. The Bend, OR teaching pastor writes about the day her and her husband Steve met "...an enemy so fierce and foul..." they named him "Goliath." Their opponent's appropriate name forecast the difficult challenges that lie ahead. Where they would learn "...the most beautiful things come out of the hardest times." Their yet unfinished true story is told in—Beautiful Battlefields.

They met "Goliath" in the doctor's office when Steve returned for additional neurological tests after initial treatments hadn't changed his condition. When they entered the room Bo thought it would be something minor, yet she soon felt a sense of dread creep into the room as the doctor probed Steve. She quietly texted her sister "...Steve's not okay. Please pray."

Eight months and multiple tests later the doctor gave their "Goliath" a name— "Amyotrophic Lateral

Bo Stern writes a compelling thesis for believing God while in the throes of a battle. This work of nonfiction exalts the Lord while sharing what He has taught her. In our society, we tend to put in place a hierarchy about anything and everything, including trials and suffering. Funny, but we won't find any of that in the Word of God. The battlefield is level and the enemy is against everyone. I appreciate so much the authenticity of the writer, sharing her family's battle from every day to yesterday to tomorrow. Steve, her husband, was thrust into a battle with ALS, Lou Gehrig's disease. No matter where we are in the journey of our life here on earth, news like this can knock anyone down, but not necessarily out.

At various times as I was reading, I wanted to shout an "amen" to what I just read for I found out some of these same truths as Bo. The book is not a novel; it isn't frilly nor does it have "pat" answers. It conveys real truth. How do any of us live today when we are sideswiped with a battle we didn't see coming nor did we want? How do we live the next moment when it seems like the battle has been going on so long we want to quit for a while? Ever feel like that?

Before you decide whether to read this book or not, know that it isn't about "major" battles or hardships. Whether our battle is in a relationship, marriage, financial trouble or a host of others, it matters not what the specific battle is as much as it depends on how we live each moment. For me, the field I was on was and is beyond my ability to put into words. I can't say that I would gladly do it again, but I wouldn't miss the truth of Him that I now know because He was there.

If you choose to read this writing of Bo Stern's, you will gain an understanding of battlefields that perhaps you hadn't known before. There are two main parts entitled: Discovering Beauty in the Hard Places and Strategies for Growing Stronger through Every Battle. No one should miss this golden opportunity to learn how to do well in a battle or how one can help someone who is in the midst of a battle. Everyone gets these experiences in our lives that leave us blindsided, the moments that make us tempted (or even do) yell at God, "WHY ME!?" These are the battles we fight. These are the struggles that Bo Stern presents and faces in her book "Beautiful Battlefields."

Bringing us into the personal and painful struggle she and her family face as they deal with an unexpected medical diagnosis of a terminal illness of her husband and best friend, Bo shares her insights of how God can use even these horrible and unfathomable experiences to be made beautiful. Comparing these events to the image of the giant of Goliath, a picture is painted of us standing against an unimaginably scary foe - and having to decide between running or standing strong in faith.

The first half of the book introduces us to the whole concept of seeing the beauty in the battle - of how God is still working, how we can see that despite the pain, how we can trust and obey. The second part is all about the tools needed to get to that point - for how to be strong and what things we need to have to get there.

Over and over again, Bo compares our individual Goliaths to battles and wars from the Bible, using the examples of each of these to show us how God can use every circumstance. She shares her experience openly, with raw emotion and vulnerability, understanding too that each person has their own battles and each is incomparable with each other.

What I really love is that each chapter is relatively short - without huge elaborate extras, straight forward and completely readable. Each one ends with both some things to think about and also a step of action - which at first glance can seem too easy, but turns out to be deep and thought provoking.

If right now is the time you look at your life and want to cry out, WHY, LORD? ... grab this book and start reading. God is good. Bo shows us how she has been learning to walk in obedience and faith throughout the hardest season of her life - and challenges us to follow along in the journey with her.

Each chapter ends with a few questions for consideration. Usually I find that this kind of thing is pretty lame in a lot of self-help books, full of predictable softball questions. But I thought her questions were astute and thought-provoking enough to actually make them worth answering. I think the whole book may be worth a second read. Read it once for comfort and encouragement. Read it again and study the Scriptures mentioned and answer the questions asked.

Bo's husband, Steve Stern, passed away this summer, by the way. (He had ALS.) I was in the middle of this book, on the same week that 2 of my friends died of cancer, when I got the update. My husband had just been through a period of suffering as well. I think that experience only deepened my appreciation of Bo's words. They held true.

Bo Stern is a teaching pastor in Bend Oregon, where she has experience teaching others how to meet and do battle with the giants in life. Having been through her own battles over the years, Bo has developed valuable techniques in taking on giants through tough times. Steve, Bo's husband of 27 years, had been a strong and healthy man who recognized the onset of some muscle weakness. Numerous medical tests eventually confirmed a diagnosis of ALS (Lou Gehrig's disease). Bo had met her Goliath. The ALS giant was the biggest and toughest of any foes she had encountered in the past, and threatened her to the core. Bo chose to fight her giant with prayer and walking through the battlefield with God at her side. Her experiences and teachings prove that beauty can sometimes only be found in the midst of the toughest times, and God's love is unconditional.

"Beautiful Battlefields" is written in two parts, "Discovering Beauty In The Hard Places," and "Strategies for Growing Stronger Through Every Battle." Bo presents biblical illustrations of battles fought and beauty found. The author writes with conviction and passion regarding the use of appropriate tools to meet our giants on the battlefield, including illness, financial hardship, marital discord, dysfunctional families, drug or alcohol abuse, physical abuse, guilt, etc. These tools can be utilized in all situations, no matter what those giants represent. Practical ideas and spiritual tools are described as a method for experiencing the beauty of God's love and His presence throughout the battles we face. This is a beautiful, informative and spiritual testimony of valuable techniques to be utilized in every day situations as well as when meeting Goliath on the battlefield. It's a transformation from bitterness to beauty.
