I like Miller's writing and his art. The man had style, and knew how to write Daredevil without making him as obnoxious as he usually can be when it comes to the whole 'no killing' thing, or when he tells people they shouldn't take the law into their own hands while he's in his freakin' costume. At his best, Miller's worked wonders with this character. Goes without saying. *Born Again* is one of the best Daredevil stories out there, and one of the best graphic novels I've ever read.

Child's Play is a big step down from there. While the story is interesting and the art is good, somehow it gets muddled in the last third when it starts to jump around a bit in confusing ways, suddenly breaking its flow and jumping between the showdown and the resolution and the showdown and the real resolution and then a random OD murder scene and then a Mexican standoff between Daredevil and the Punisher that literally goes nowhere. A printing error, perhaps? Or was this how the original comic issues were? I couldn't say for sure, but it seems like they were printed out of chronological order.

Speaking of Mr. Castle, he was pretty one-dimensional here. Given how good Miller is with his anti-heroes, I was disappointed with the way Punisher was handled here. He barely needed to be here, as he served no real purpose except to give Daredevil another excuse to throw around his 'no-killing' rule some more and thwart Castle's assassination attempts whenever possible. Not much to go off of there.

Still, it was a quick read, and at least it was nice to look at.
