First off, let me state that I am a very happily married woman. So when I say that I want an Eryx for myself, that is saying something about him. This is a fun romp with gods and mortals, with a female character I liked so much. Maia Douglas is a conservator at the Toronto Museum, specializing in the Greek era. She is intelligent, self deprecating, messy and very nearly obsessed with all things Greek, particularly the statue that stands in the Greek hall, that of Eryx, the Greek God of Love. Maia has worked her entire career at this Museum, which was also the place her father worked, and helped make big. Her mother was an artist who left her and her father when she was five, so it was always just the two of them. Dr. Douglas took Maia on digs, and shared his passion for antiquities with her, a passion she shares. Her father is actually the one who found the Eryx statue, and when Maia was five he took her to see it. She loved it, but when she was leaving the hall she stuck her tongue out (I mean, she's FIVE) and the statue winked at her. Impossible, right? Right. But it's made her love Eryx (the statue) and dream of Eryx (the god) since then. Her father is in hospice, most of her coworkers think she is odd, she hasn't many friends. What she has is her work, and her statue.

Eryx is the Greek God of Love. He is also carrying a world of guilt around, due to a curse courtesy of the vengeful, nasty goddess Nemesis. In an effort to keep women safe, he focuses not on love but on antiquities. He presents as a mortal named Eric Lord and he goes to museums as a director, cleaning house. He is now setting his sights on the Toronto Museum. When he arrives and immediately fires someone, Maia is outraged. Then she sees him.

"Her hands dropped. And then her jaw dropped. If the elastic on her Hanes hadn't been so strong, her panties would have dropped too."

Unfortunately, the first thing Eric Lord does is let her know he is putting the Eryx statue on loan to Russia. Maia, too on edge from everything going on, bursts into tears and makes Eric feel awful. Something he hasn't felt in a long time, caring about someone else. He "loved" a priestess, Chloe, and due to his own behavior it ended badly. He tells himself he is a different man now, but is he?

Imagine trying to deal with a boss who looks just like your secret statue obsession, while he's dealing with god issues.

The writing of this book is witty, clever and so likeable. The characters are lively and real. I would so love to read a Dino story, Maia's gay friend who is absolutely fabulous (he tells Maia, "you are a recipe for premature ejaculation if I've ever seen one"). Apollo and Artemis are beautiful and bad-ass, and Dionysus (god of wine!) is unapologetically horny yet loyal and a worthy friend.

There are just little things that made me laugh (Eric trying to hide a "massive hard-on behind a floor lamp", I mean how big IS that thing?) and there were things that were sad (Chloe, Maia's loneliness) and it's all put together in a quirky, very fun read. Very recommended.

I have no idea why it took me so long to read this book. It's been on my list since last year. I'm glad I finally got around to it. :)

I'm sorry, but I just need to get this out of the way first. I usually have a *very* hard time reading books based on Greek mythology. It's a subject very dear to me and I've been studying it since I was a child. So many stories that use Greek mythology either deliberately change things or outright get them wrong (don't even get me started on the travesty of Disney's that was Hercules), and that usually makes it impossible for me to enjoy a story. In one way, this book was no exception. From the very first pages, I had a hard time with the Greek god of love being named Eryx instead of Eros. Eryx was a king and a demigod, not a god himself. He was killed in a boxing match after stealing one of Herakles' bulls and challenging Herakles during Herakles'

labors. Eros is the son of Aphrodite and Ares and is the god of love, who fell in love with Psyche and lost her because she was convinced to not trust him. There were other errors in the mythology as well, but they were so common that they were a little easier for me to accept, such as Apollo and Artemis being the god and goddess of the sun and moon, instead of music/medicine/prophesy and the hunt. But they are so often confused with their Roman counterparts that I've come to expect it.

Honestly, this caused me to almost put the book down after only three pages. But I kept going because I like Rosanna Leo's writing and wanted to give it a chance. So I did my best to suspend my reflexive judgement and chose to think of these gods as separate, fictional entities loosely based on the ones I've known and loved for so many years.

This is the first time I have ever given a book that took such license with Greek mythology such a high rating. And it is completely due to how much I liked the characters and how fun I thought the story was.

This was a very sweet love story and I loved Maia. Her geekiness and awkwardness was so much fun to me. I really thought Eric was going to be nasty and arrogant toward her for much of the book, while he fought his feelings for her, but that wasn't the case. Instead, he was very sweet and I couldn't help but love him too. I also adored Dionysos. While he didn't go around inspiring madness in people, he was quite into debauchery. He was a bit twisted, but funny, and I couldn't help but be fond of him. I'm looking forward to seeing what kind of woman brings him to his knees.

This book was perfect for me! It had the right amount of well-placed humor in the witty one-liners, as well as some self-deprecating humor on Maia's part. I have always loved books that tackle Greek mythology in one form or another. Typically the Gods are a selfish, over-indulgent bunch who often resemble children throwing tantrums and fighting over their favorite toys – mortals. They play with humans and their fates and care nothing for the consequences.

Enter Eric Lord aka Eryx, God of Love. His guilt and torment over the fate of his last love made him the perfect tortured hero. Meeting Maia changes him. Aside from her ability to make him laugh, she shared his most cherished passion – Greek mythology. Falling for her proves to him that love will not be denied, and that perhaps it was time he took his life back instead of letting Nemesis control him through his worst fears.

I loved Maia. She's your average, geeky young woman. She was neither fat nor thin, though she'd probably

She thinks she must be going crazy, it couldn't possibly be him. He's only myth...right? As soon as he arrives, the department is being turned upside down, and layoffs are happening left and right. Maia fears she may be next, but Lord Eric begins to act strange around her. Almost as if this insanely gorgeous man... was attracted to her? Maia feels like she really must be going insane. She's so clouded by her insecurities she can't comprehend the fantasy becoming reality, and as we find out Lord Eric can't even explain why he's so drawn to her. He proves to her his identity and romance buds right before our eyes, but when we the reader least expect it, the plot really thickens.
