Has got a beautiful abstract cover, a promising synopsis and even started so strong but somehow in the middle of it all, it loses vigor and ends in a mess. Ruchi Banerjee thought up a great concept for her story but it lacks finesse.

Set in the distant future 2173. 16 years old Mira is our protagonist. Humans are almost in the endangered

category now and just like any normal teenager she only cares about her dues. And then reality comes crashing when she accompanies her mother to a remote research facility and meets gorgeous Neel and comes face to face with the bleak nature of their life and what was actually happening outside.

The author did great with the world building and bringing her story to life. Even providing it with such a strong start and a powerful motifs to bring on the action too but it starts to lose focus after that and even a lot of info-dump too in the middle which was very disorienting. I am all for shorter stories, the last one I checked, "All you need is Kill" (the book from which the movie 'Edge of Tomorrow' is adapted) was even shorter than this and it packed quite the punch but here it needed a balanced build-up which sadly I didn't find. And that epilogue was definitely not needed.

This was a very exciting and imaginative read, but I can't say that it was a romance, because really it wasn't. This is the first book of this type I've ever read and I was not sure what to expect, however I can say I was pleasantly surprised.

The story was REALLY good; it captured me right from the start. I found myself trying to find time to continue reading. The story is set in 2173 and centers around a young woman, Mira, and her mom. All the humans live in the sectors that they are born in, never to leave them. Mira's mom gets passes and they fly on an xeppels, which are future flying ships, and go to the jungle where Mira's mom will pair up with a co-worker from her past. Everything that takes place in Mira's new home is much different than anything she could have imagined. Once she's settled in, she meets a few people, not sure if you could call all of them friends, but one of them, Neel, takes a particular liking to Mira. These new friends take Mira on a particular adventurous journey. While reading this part of the book I swear I was in awe of a particular scene every bit as much as Mira was. The world building was spectacular and I could not turn the pages fast enough. But with the jungle comes many dangers which Mira faced time and time again. I don't want to say too much and give the story away.

My favorite character of course was Mira. She was very bright and tried to stay brave even under the most horrific of situations. There was a different species that was introduced too, they were a super race called Erons. The Erons were faster, smarter and stronger than humans, but they were also very BAD and dangerous and posed a threat to the humans.
