...Al Kaplan, an ex husband still carrying a red-hot torch.
...Sal Maggio, a man of many interests, most of them illegal who has a highly personal reason for wanting this film to succeed.

The story moves headlong toward an exciting and unexpected ending, weaving it's way through a web of blackmail, betrayal and extortion.
