Vampires in suburban Denver what a kick. They go into debt buying HDTVs and drop in on fang bars which are squeezed between the Starbucks and the marijuana dispensaries. Despite the fun this book left me flat. It reads almost as a sanitized version of Interview with a Vampire. Colin=Lestat, Sebastian=Louis, and Nim=Claudia. Angst, guilt, and repulsion have been removed. Instead the plot is driven by a rock and a bad guy. Oh yes, the old McGuffin plot which was already worn out in the 1950s. I wish the suburban Denver aspect of the story had actually played a part in a plot. This story was weaknesses in believability of the characters. Sebastian and Colin supposedly are hundreds of years old but they use the language of modern teenagers complete with overuse of the F word. I wished they'd drop in a "god damn" Or "bloody" every once in awhile.

The story is quite violent and shows little compassion for those who are suffering and dying. The heroine shoots corrosive liquid in the eyes of vampires and seems to think this is funny. Sure it's holy water but the effect is worse than sulfuric acid.

I do think many readers will enjoy the story as a light and humorous, but I wanted more from it.
