Little does she know that when she crosses paths with a sexy sultry Italian woman named Bette, that her

life would be forever changed. But it all starts with Bette and then continues with a beautiful violin that seems to call to her. Claire is told that it is enchanted and only speaks to some, but Claire soon learns that there is more going on than she thinks.

Something Chosen by Alex Owens is book one in the Shadow Vampire series. This book doesn't start off like typical vampire novels, of where you're told that all humans know about vampires, and that they are common knowledge. The vampires are in the shadows, but they aren't the only creatures around. Claire is told that she is chosen, but that doesn't mean that her regular life is not done and over. As you'll see for yourself her own life continues to deteriorate around her piece by piece. The story is well written overall. It's enjoyable, but for me, it was a bit dull in the beginning. For a bit, I was waiting for something truly exciting to happen to engage me fully into the story. But she's very controlled and remains that for most of the story. I wanted more from her in certain moments as a character.

First of all, let me say that I am a long time lover of all things vampire. I have reads hundreds of vampire-related books.

This book was a surprising book for me. The idea of a woman having empathic type abilities, yet never knowing it, then being unknowingly turned into a vampire could have led to a great story. Instead, it fell short for me.

I found it unrealistic that a woman of Claire's age could have the type of "magical" abilities she is supposed to have and be totally unaware of them a little too much to swallow. For me, the book turned into more of an orgy of vampire sex and strip clubs, with Claire as an unwilling party. She changes from an ordinary housewife and mother into a sex-crazed vampire with encounters with both sexes equally fun for her in one day.

Parts of the book were intriguing. I enjoyed the fact that Claire was able to become a musical phenomenon

just by being in close proximity with a person (or vamp) with musical talent. She does eventually take charge of her own destiny, but it took way too long for her to come to that point.

Also, I really didn't like any of the characters. I have a hard time really enjoying a book when I don't like any of the characters. The vampires were inconsistent in their actions, sometimes being the take-charge beings that I have come to expect, then becoming wimpy in another scene.

Also it would have been nice if the author would have done some research on Italian language before writing the book... the spelling mistakes took me out of the story: "perfecto" instead of "perfetto", "grazi" instead of "grazie", "Vicenza" instead of "Venezia", "mi dolce" instead of "mia cara" (or something that sounded less as broken Italian).
