Perfect for when you need some Victorian Era paranormal escapism with a side of possibly-doomed love and a gorgeous cover. Don't take it too seriously, just enjoy, possibly with popcorn if that's your thing. Cara Moreau, a mixed-race woman whose father was French and of African descent, is a medium. Quin St. Clair is some kind of immortal warrior with the power to protect Cara from the curse that's killing her. Not that he'll tell her how that works, or much of anything really, just that they have to find a certain spellbook to lift the curse. The lack of information is as annoying as Quin is H-O-T. Not that Cara's thinking about that. Oh no. (Except she totally is, duh.)

Cara's a smart lady, and I enjoyed her taking Quin to task for his outmoded ideas about women's place in society. The book doesn't make Cara's race a central issue, but there are definitely moments where its impact on how other people react to her - notably, her wry comment that she's viewed as "exotic." The romance was possibly a tiny bit underdeveloped compared to the race for the spellbook, but there were plenty of pitch-perfect swoony moments to make up for it.

Also, I dug the moment when Quin meets a man using a wheelchair, and instead of reacting like "oh wow, what a tragedy you can't walk!", he's impressed with how useful the "device" is.

This is the beginning of a third trilogy set in the same group of interconnected characters, and I could definitely tell, but nothing was confusing and I didn't feel like it took away from my enjoyment of the story. Whatever happened in those previous trilogies felt like it had been resolved there. It seems like each trilogy is about a particular couple, with the HEA at the end of Book 3 - given that at the end of this book, Cara and Quin are not yet together for good. I'm definitely interested enough to keep reading the series.

In the first book of C.J. Archer's 3rd Freak House Trilogy "Ghost Girl," we are treated to Cara Moreau's story. As you will know if you've read the other books in the series, as well as the Emily Chambers Spirit Medium Trilogy, Cara is a spirit medium. As part of the action which ended the 2nd Freak House Trilogy, Cara was affected by a supernatural curse and as the book opens, she is dying. On that somber note comes Quin St. Clair, a mysterious warrior from an unknown realm, to keep Cara close to him and thereby keep her alive. The third trilogy is, so far, the most disappointing of the series and seems to plod along at times. I still liked it enough to move on to the next book, but it's a little bittersweet when I think Cara deserves a stronger story since she is such a fascinating and different character than is typical for this genre/period. I think Archer does her an injustice with her shallow portrayal of what could be a deeper, more complex protagonist. Hopefully, more depth of character will be found in the next books.

If you're new to Archer's work or to the Freak House series, I'd suggest starting with the First Freak House Trilogy instead, the Emily Chambers series (which precedes the Freak House Books, but shares the same world) or, my personal favorite by Archer, the Ministry of Curiosities Series (unrelated to the other series, but I think it's her best as yet).
