Spectacular. Dax and Kailyn's "meet cute" was the cutest, but what happens later on in their lives is even better. This story just hit me on so many different emotional levels, and I loved them all.

I wanted so much to love this and there was a lot to like—Dax and Kailyn were a good couple and Emme was fantastic—but it ended up being just okay.

Some of the reasons:

1. The cover leads one to believe this is a rom-com. It's a "rom" for sure, but by no measure is it a "com," in spite of a couple of semi-comedic scenes. It's all orphans and custody agreements and battles over a trust and family law and things that are just not funny.
2. Kailyn is adopted? I mean, yes, she's adopted, but it's more hinted at than talked about until the very end. And there were hints that her pre-adoption childhood wasn't good, but it was never talked about.
3. The law school relationship between Dax and Kailyn is...weird. At first, it sort of sounded like they had dated and then maybe that they were just friends or maybe they just passed notes?
4. The villain was kind of cartoonish and their nefarious plot was way too obvious right from the start, though maybe not the motivations behind it.
5. Some of the characterization—especially that of Beverly—was inconsistent, or at least felt that way. Hard-ass ladyboss or compassionate mentor?

Admittedly, this was an early, uncorrected proof, so there is time for some of these issues to be corrected before the final version hits the streets. There really is a lot to like here and had the cover been different, my entire reaction to the book might have been, too. I expected a rom-com and, not getting one, was more critical as I was reading than I would have been had I just been able to be swept up in a frothy rom-com or emotionally girded for a more serious contemporary Romance.
