Did you ever look at a picture that was so captivating and inviting you wished you could lose yourself in it? How about watching a movie or theatre performance after which instead of just clapping, words like “bravo” and “encore” should be shouted? Well be prepared to do both with this novel in all seriousness. What drew me to the novel was the picture on the cover and the title that I figured was a purposeful play on words. The novel grabs a hold from the first chapter till the last. The suspense was intense! I wanted to continue reading it straight through once I started, but my eyes didn’t agree. So the next day I would start where I had left off, and lost all sense of time. I couldn’t have asked for a better story to get lost in.

It is more than an apparent murder mystery or a well done framing of an excellent DEA agent. There are more twists and turns in the pages than a climbing ivy vine. Alec had been on the Florida Police Department when his life took a turn he thought he would never recover from...his only child, who was also his best friend, goes missing. They shared a love for many things including scuba diving. Now, on the Cayman Islands, he is an inspector who continues to try and solve his missing offspring’s case. Alec prayed for closure in whatever way it came. LeLisa is a top notch DEA agent on Cayman Island for a supposed vacation, one which she never chose, but was forced to take. During her dive one morning, her diving buddy dies. No matter how hard she tries to come to terms with it, she just can’t seem to understand. More than anything else she wants answers as to why it happened.

Two souls lost in grief; Alec’s grief is almost two years old, and LeLisa is just starting the process. Two people who build walls around their hearts in order to do their jobs and not be hurt deeply again by losing someone they love or care about. Now, the tragedy has brought them together, but this is just the beginning of action and adventure as they search for answers. Someone wants LeLisa dead, now Alec too since he is in the way and getting too close to finding answers.

Believe it or not Hidden Son is the author’s debut novel and it is fantastic. I cannot wait for the sequel! The characters, scenes, action, and faith-based novel will probably keep you turning pages and losing track of time too. The plot was rich as well as entertaining; I wanted to see the David in this book slay the Goliath with every page I turned. Alec Dyer, Inspector for the Royal Cayman Islands Police Service, plagued by his daughter's unsolved disappearance almost two years ago and pestered by his ex-wife, isn't sure he believes Lelisa's claims of innocence, especially when crucial evidence she claims to possess disappears.

What I liked...

First off, what an awesome cover, don't you think? It sums up the tone for the story. The author kept me biting my nails with an intense forward motion, a well-developed plot, and towards the end, a totally unexpected twist. Each character was unique, flavorful and realistic. This is one of those books that will stick with me for a long time.

and not so much...

At times, the technical jargon was a bit overwhelming, heavier than I generally prefer to read, but I willingly waded through because I enjoyed everything else about the book. Take my advice and keep going. You'll be glad you did.

I felt the spiritual aspect of *The Hidden Son* was lacking and somewhat forced, almost like an afterthought. It didn't contain cuss words or bedroom scenes, but if you're a strict CBA reader, you may find this book tends to be a bit on the "fringe."

I immediately downloaded *The Hidden Son* after reading *Final Trimester*. I was not disappointed. It is a must-read for any avid suspense reader. I was hooked from the opening scene. My heart was beating fast—I felt myself dive into the story and couldn't put it down. Although *The Hidden Son* is Dianna Benson's debut book, you would not realize it from the engaging storyline, the details in the writing, or the edge-of-your seat suspense. Lelisa is a U.S. DEA agent who suspects her boss is trying to kill her because she will not bury evidence in a high-profile case. When her friend dies while they are vacationing on the Cayman Islands, Alec the local detective gets involved. Alec is not sure what to think of Lelisa and he knows she is not sharing everything she knows. Both characters are very likable. You want her to trust him but you totally understand why she doesn't after all that's happened. The secondary storyline of Alec's missing daughter of two years adds to the already fast-paced and intense drama. My favorite scene was when he found her magazine and her notes in it. There were at least two scenes where I was holding my breath from the intensity. Another reason I recommend this book for a book club discussion is the book's interesting discussion about what parents will do to protect their children and to what lengths they will go. I recommend reading *The Hidden Son* and *Third Trimester* in order to get the full impact of the characters. I highly recommend this book if you like action and suspense with a subtle dose of inspiration.

My thoughts: I am simply amazed that a first published novel can be so enthralling, engrossing, engaging, and exciting as *The Hidden Son* is. Dianna T. Benson has taken us from the beauty of the Cayman Isles to the depths (pun intended) of diving into the devious and destructive world of murder and mayhem. We're speaking of hit men who are law enforcement officers and who are working at the beck and call of real power players in law enforcement.

Agent Lelisa is on the run to preserve her life and tagging along, much to her consternation, is Cayman Isles Inspector Alex. Who can Lelisa trust? Who can Alex trust? Can they trust each other? Where does all this murder and mayhem originate? Who is behind it all? What is behind it all?

Attempts on Lelisa's life get her running from the Caymans back to home in Raleigh, North Carolina. But it isn't easy. Trouble is following her and pursuing her. There is intense action in *The Hidden Son* and the story

is multi-layered. Inspector Alex is grieving the loss of his 16 year old daughter who went missing two years prior on his watch as detective at the FLPD. When he was removed from the force and the case he moved to the Caymans. Lelisa is grieving the loss of her friend and (sometime) boyfriend, Rick, who died in the diving accident at the beginning of the story.

This is a faith based story that does not preach. In crisis, Alex shares prayer and faith in God with Lelisa in a limited way. But it is effective. And then I especially enjoyed the EMT action in the story and know that the author is writing from her personal experience as an EMT herself. Benson has created believable characters and dialogue that smacks right at the heart of the story.

Since I'm from North Carolina, when they were running around Raleigh, Durham, and I-40 and I-440 I could envision the neighborhoods. I've shopped in Raleigh, worked and shopped in Durham. I could mentally visualize the chase. I've been to the hospital and walked its corridors. The author wrote beautifully of the Caymans and of North Carolina. (And yes, as Alex observes, North Carolina has lots of trees and flowers!)

I anticipate reading more from Dianna T. Benson as the other two books in this Cayman Islands Trilogy are released. It has been a pleasure to read this book and review it. I hope to be a reviewer for Dianna T. Benson in the future!

Through the first half of the book I was thinking 5-star for the story and its characters -- Lelisa the DEA Special Agent mourning the death of her dive partner and suffering decompression sickness from trying to save him, and the handsome Royal Cayman Island Police Inspector Alec Dyer who sees Lelisa as a prime suspect. Early development of their characters and the potential relationship between them was great reading. But when the villain became more aggressive and the chase accelerated, the story seemed to lose control. Too much happened that didn't feel necessary (could have been a second book easily with further development of these characters).

I downloaded the book after reading the reviews and thought I was getting a good read. That didn't happen. It wasn't just the horrible editing, which had missing words, some half words, tons of power words that made no sense, punctuation marks in wrong places and the list goes on. A lot of words seemed to only be there as a filler. And religion popped up at weird points in the book. That was bad enough. The story was not believable, things happened that would not happen within a police force or government. One such incident without doing a spoiler: A rookie cop with a history of brain damage. They would have failed the physiological test alone. The characters were also not believable. One second they vow to totally trust the other, the next their thinking the other is betraying them. Short attraction scenes happened at unlikely times. I am truly trying to think of something good to say about this read, but it is hard. The first chapter was interesting but the story went downhill from there.

This could have been a good story, but it just did not happen.

If you can get past the bad writing, you might like the story but I wouldn't recommend it to anyone. I could not connect with this book at all. This is my personal take on the book. I would not put this Author in my list of people to read.
