There was quite a bit of action and the religious aspect of it fit with the antiquated ideas of how the characters behaved. Both Faith and Peter had some immature mental dialogue that added to the non-connection of the characters for me.

Basically we have a kidnapped damsel in distress Faith, a knight Peter with some friends who is the wielder of the Sword of St. Michael off to slay the dragon. The dragon has some very funny one-liners at times and a very malevolent side. Some of the banter between the friends is somewhat entertaining.

There are some interesting demons and other characters along the way as we twist and turn within the cavern under the church. While I did enjoy many parts of the book I could not for some reason feel a connection with the characters.
