Frankly, I confused Caton with one of the other UK detectives who has a son he didn't know about until some years after the child was born and they are about to or have just had a child with a new partner. I can think of three current UK police series where this is a case so maybe writers can find a new way to complicate their protagonists lives or at least make it a surprise daughter next time. Anyway, Caton found out about his son earlier in the series, but his wife is just about to give birth in this addition to the series.

Apart from the cliched family situation, it was an okay book, but longer and more convoluted than I think it needed to be and I'm still not sure if all the suspects were resolved and I think the ending was a bit pat. I felt this book was a bit rushed and the plotting had some abrupt segues. I felt this especially after I found out that one of the police characters was going to be the lead in a new series of books. Also, Caton goes out of his way to establish a bit of info about the victim, which is crucial to establishing identify and then soon after the author got this info wrong and then right again.

So parts of it were interesting and I liked the main characters (reading the new series now), but if I hadn't read the rest of the series, I might not have finished this one. So I suggest to a new reader of this series to start at the beginning.
