I had never read anything by this author before, but the description looked interesting so I gave it a try. It was a bit slow moving in parts and I wasn't sure how accurate the gang lifestyle information was, but it was an interesting and different kind of love story.

Dante is an EX gang member on parole and he has to maintain his job as a trainer to keep on the right side of the law. Enter Ricki...a woman with self esteem issues, body image insecurities and a need to prove herself worthy of being loved. Her former BF dumped her (his reasons we will discover later on, were valid) and she hopes that by working out and losing weight, she will be more desirable. Of course she and Dante eventually cross lines of their client/trainer relationship and things get pretty steamy as well as confusing, as Dante keeps pushing her away and trying to stay in the friend-zone.

The details of his childhood and tragic past love slowly get revealed and Ricki learns eventually why he is the way he is and together they eventually come to an understanding (but not before some scary things happen and Dante almost gets himself and a friend in serious trouble).

It was an action packed, but at times calm love story of two people from opposite lifestyles who find common ground.

Therefore, she signs up at a gym with a personal trainer to help her work out and get a firmer, better body. Ricky's biggest problem is she has little athletic ability. Ricky is a spirited woman who is very upfront with everyone around her and does not play games.

Dante is a former gang member that is on probation. He has to stay on the straight and narrow until his probation term is up. However, Dante is not to associate with anyone in his past so he sneaks around to help a friend get out of the gang. When work requests he double his workload so he will quit. I was given an ARC to give an honest review. Julia Derek has followed up her opening book (Trigger) in her LA Girls series with another winner. Once again, Derek delivers an intriguing plot, finely-drawn characters and hot physical encounters that are unusually well-written and authentic. The female protagonist was introduced to readers in her earlier book, Trigger, and Derek fleshes this character out to be totally believable and someone with whom the reader swiftly empathizes. Derek's depiction of feisty yet vulnerable female protagonists is excellent.

Derek's male protagonist is a strong alpha male character but with a softer side, and both female and male readers will relate well to him. He has a shady past in the gangster world, and this appears to have been well-researched and rings true.

In this novel I believe that Derek has focused more on the connection between the protagonists and this is a sure sign of her increasing maturity as an author. As in Trigger, the minor characters are well-crafted and memorable and, as noted in the "About the Author" section at the end of the book, her next novel in the series will be focused on Gabi, a minor character introduced in Love Cursed. Overall, another excellent read from Derek who is shaping up to be a serious player in this genre. I look forward with eager anticipation to her next offering.
