Jimmy Little, a fourteen-year-old boy, and his estranged father are reunited after nine years. The father is dying of a kidney ailment and has escaped from prison to share the truth of his past and to re-establish a relationship with his son. Jimmy embarks on a physical and psychological journey as he and his father explore their pasts. Because his mother died when he was a baby and because his father has been in prison,

Jimmy never had the opportunity to learn about his roots until being reunited with his father. Jimmy is initially reluctant to develop a relationship with his father, but he soon opens his heart and mind and learns from his father the mistakes he does not want to make in his future. Although Jimmy realizes his father is unable to depart from his illegal ways, he comes to believe that his father was falsely accused and did not kill anyone.

When Jimmy's father revisits an ex-partner-in-crime, he is betrayed again, captured by the police, and dies cuffed to his hospital bed with Jimmy at his side. Throughout the novel, Jimmy transforms from confused teenager who is bright but often daydreams and skips school to a mature young adult. He gains insights into what it means to be an adult and more importantly, a father.
