Parker Richardson has never forgotten Tanya or the way she hurt him. He's convinced himself he's gotten over her and moved on; until he's face to face with her again.

I loved Parker the instant he was introduced in Kiss Me, Dancer. What's not to love? At seventeen Parker took over his father's lawn care business and the responsibility of providing for his mother and sister's. Ten years later he's a drool worthy man in more than deed with a body hewn from hard honest labor and a steadfastness that just doesn't quit. As I said, what's not to love?

Tanya was a selfish spoiled little rich girl who seduced Parker, the gardener's son. For over three years they carried on a clandestine affair until, afraid of what she felt for Parker and reacting to her father's betrayal, Tanya cruelly throws Parker's love back in his face and runs away to Europe.

Thanks to her mother Eva's accident Tanya is back in North Cove. She's never forgotten Parker nor has he forgotten her but do they remember each other for the right reasons or all the wrong ones?

TOUCH ME AND TANGO is an adventurous romantic romp with the additional thrill of a hidden treasure map and a dangerous threat from Parker's past to mix things up a bit. There's still the warm sense of community and extended family that was so appealing in Kiss Me, Dancer but TOUCH ME AND TANGO has a feistier attitude. If anyone deserved a spirited adventure it's Parker and it was a treat to be along for the ride.

This is book two in a series and even though I didn't read the first one, I never missed a beat. There was no

confusion at all.

The heroine is a ballroom dancer who at first is not very likable at all. I had a hard time with her character up till about 85% percent when she basically admitted she was a mean girl. For reasons I didn't quite understand, she spurned her lover in high school, said some mean things to him, treated his sister like dirt, and as an adult, goes partner to partner (literally) and is about to marry a man she doesn't love just for the money. BUT there's a valid reason for that too.

Tanya and Parker meet again when Tanya goes back to her hometown to help her mother. There's a lost treasure mystery, old feelings of resentment and love both, a moment of eating crow for Tanya. (She needs his sister. I like that this was kind of a moral. At least, in my eyes it was.) Things go from bad to worse when Tanya's fiance shows up with his true colors in tow and a bad person from Parker's past pops in as well...and everyone wants old Uncle Harry's treasure.

When her mother breaks her leg and needs help, professional ballroom dancer Tanya Gentilliano packs up her dancing shoes and heads to her hometown, only to find that things are far worse than she could have imagined. Her mother's on the verge of losing the house and insists that there's a fortune in diamonds belonging to their family buried on an island close to home. To make matters worse, Tanya's mother has enlisted the help of Parker Richardson, Tanya's ex-boyfriend, in the search for the diamonds. It's been more than a decade since Tanya broke Parker's heart and left him behind to pursue her dreams, but old wounds — and desire — create sparks whenever Tanya and Parker are around one another. Will Tanya be able to convince Parker to give her a second chance? She may not find out, for the search for the diamonds takes a deadly turn that endangers all that Tanya and Parker hold dear.

I love a good reunion romance, and TOUCH ME AND TANGO is definitely that. Tanya and Parker have true chemistry that brings them together and real problems that have to be dealt with if they want to overcome their shared past. Tanya hurt Parker deeply, but she isn't a bad person. She's searching for what she wants out of life and watching her character develop over the course of TOUCH ME AND TANGO was a delight. Whether the scenes take place in the ballroom or in the bedroom, authors Alicia and Roy Street make TOUCH ME AND TANGO sizzle. I particularly enjoyed the scenes involving dance, as Mr. and Ms. Street make the world of ballroom dance come to life fabulously. Unfortunately, what dragged the book down a bit for me was the inclusion of a suspense subplot three-quarters of the way through the story. I won't spoil the story by providing details, but I will say that this plot thread was hard to believe, unnecessary and took the fast-paced energy of the book down a few notches. Still, I thought TOUCH ME AND TANGO was an enjoyable story overall, and I look forward to reading more DANCE 'N' LOVE books.

This was a quick read. I just "liked" it, didn't "love" it. Why? Because the authors didn't develop scenes with the emotional tension I was anticipating from their own set-up! For instance, Tanya is an internationally acclaimed ballroom dancer. Her jilted ex-lover, Parker, is trying to resist her charms. He seems unable to help being a little jealous when his dancer & studio-owner sister tells him Tanya has partnered up with her lusty-hot ballroom teacher. He even asks sis if the guy has a "good build." (What?! Oh, yes, he did! LOL!) Anyway, I'm waiting on pins and needles for the upcoming ballroom dancing demonstration, thinking we're going to get some detailed description on Tanya's and Julio's sexy tango and what feelings that might invoke in Parker. Do we get it? Nope. Parker doesn't even show. What about later, when they perform at a charity event that Parker attends? Yeah, he sees it. No description whatsoever from any perspective. How did he feel about it? Not sure. Things like that kept happening. It was very frustrating.

There were a few points that were delivered on, don't get me wrong, but the title is *Touch Me and Tango*! Come on! Even Parker and Tanya end up tangoing and all I get for a description is that it was "scintillating." Thanks. Show me, don't tell me! Argh!

Also, for those of you who like to read a romance that doesn't have explicitly detailed sex scenes, this fits the bill. I don't mind either way, but the sex scenes here didn't evoke any emotion in me. They were executed with a clinical overview of the activity and no depth of feeling was portrayed. It left me saying, "So what?" When written well, just a kiss can get my heart (or other parts) swelling! Not here.

This book could have been so much more interesting: a previously selfish person shedding that skin, love reunited, sexy ballroom dancing, a diamond hunt, and a threatening villain. Good ideas, could have been better. I liked it. Could have loved it! I hear the first one was better--I may try it and see! (That reminds me: one other good point is that you do not need to read these books in order. Kudos to the authors for managing that feat!)
