The title intrigued me. The description was enticing giving just enough to have you wondering what was going on. If you don't like cheating in novels you will not enjoy this. If you think that once the hero has found his soul mate and then is physical with another woman you will not enjoy this. I absolutely love second chance romances but this premise is very hard to swallow because there is absolutely no excuse for cheating and it really cheapens the entire "romance" aspect (for me at least).

Yes, the hero in this novel really is named Tango Rossi. And the catch phrase between the hero and heroine is asking each other if they've "danced yet today" and he calls her "babylove".

Do with that information what you will but this is about the cheesiest thing I have ever read between two people.

Our story begins with Slade who is trying to live her life free from the horrors of her past. She has many secrets that only she knows about, including trying to unsuccessfully forget about the man who betrayed her six years ago. The same man who is back in town after learning that his mother has passed away.

Tango Rossi wants to make amends with Slade. He regrets everything he did in the past and wants Slade back in his life. But Slade is keeping a big secret that threatens to tear them apart and she isn't sure if she can trust her heart to Tango again.

I think Tango had A LOT more grovelling to do regarding the cheating aspect of the novel. Slade does keep a lot of big secrets as well, things she should have told Tango a long time ago, but she only reacted to the situation as best she could.

The entire novel is a strange mix between crime, bikers and mafia. Tango, from everything I gleaned, is of

Latin decent, but his last name is Italian which confused me. I think I must have missed something but he speaks to Slade in Spanish near the end of the novel?

The whole mafia part of the story was very odd as well. I thought it was very unbelievable that (view spoiler).

Also another big warning, besides the cheating, is this book also contains some slut-shaming. Tango calls this girl Kaylee a whore for sleeping with his dad, even though his dad is the one sleeping with a women Tango's age right after his wife dies...and Tango also calls girls that I presume hang around the mafia family (confused on that) "Luciano's whores" even though he is the one sleeping with all these women? Supposedly even though he loves Slade so much....

Slade wasn't a terrible character. I had to admire her gumption, her determination in life and whatever was thrown at her she tried to do her best. In terms of the romance though I hated how easily she forgave Tango and her indecision was a bit much. For example she would tell Tango that he couldn't touch her at all and in her head, she would say over and over again that she couldn't fall for Tango again, but then she would decide to go skinny dipping with him. Obviously fully knowing having them together naked is a bad idea. I normally don't mind this kind of stuff because it leads to good sexual tension but Slade was a bit ridiculous. I wanted to love *Truck Stop Tango*, I really did. Unfortunately, I just couldn't. It's interesting and has action, suspense, mystery and a little heat, but the pacing is off, doesn't answer all the questions it raises, has way too many subplots, and the H, Tango, is a douche bag. The setup is this: Tango and Slade have been best friends since they were little kids. She's the daughter of the town whore, ugh, I really hate that phrase but it's

hammered into our heads that this is what she is, is considered white trash (another phrase **I REALLY HATE**) and he's the son of really wealthy, conservative parents. As they become teenagers, they start dating and fall in love, much to the horror of his asshole parents. Then, for some reason, on the night of their prom, he cheats on her with her friend, Addison, and she catches them in the act. The next day, he bails, and she doesn't see him again for 6 years.

But, now, he's back in town for his mother's funeral, and determined to get his one true love, Slade, back.
