The next morning, the Yankee army rides into town and burns down their farm; this makes Andrew angry, and he decides he is going to go off and find his brother. Early the next morning, he sets out on a long tough journey. He makes many stops along the way, and he finally meets a preacher that can take him all the way to the camp where his brother left from. Andrew, upon arrival, finds out that his brother is a deserter; this infuriates him, and he knows that there is only one place he would have went. Angry, frustrated, and tired Andrew sets out to find Miss Mary Wards house: Julius's so called girlfriend. He makes it to his house and her parents welcome him in; they eat and chat for a bit. Sometime during there meal Julius steps out from another room and startles Andrew. He will not talk to him because he ran away. They get into a big argument, and Andrew leaves with Dash to go off to fight for his family's honor since Julius wimped out.
