I'm not a huge fan.

After reading its synopsis, I checked it out on GoodReads too and I was excited to see some very good ratings there. So after my requested on NetGalley was accepted, I was extremely thrilled and I had a strong feeling I was in for another treat this month!

And in I went, with high expectations, anticipating some great romance and killer plot. It is with sorrow and distress that I sadly have to say that this book did not deliver.

The premise of this novel was original and potentially interesting. But it was not executed very well in my opinion and it was predictable and frustrating at times.

Davey is 18 year old, attending High School and mixing with the wrong crowd. She and her "boyfriend" Palmer sell drugs to other students at school and parties, and do everything and anything that is illicit basically. Davey is a truly badass character in a slutty and bratty way and she has no control over her hormones -and this bothered me not little -. She is anti everything, and anything she does or says gets her in trouble. At home, with her mom, with her stepdad, at school, with the police.I don't normally judge the author's choice on the characters' personal traits, but her sluttiness did not do it for me. Especially because she is 18 years of age.Ugh! And the way she acts around complete strangers is disgraceful and shameful. I just couldn't bring myself to like her. Davey was a big no no from the start.

Ethan is the absurdly good looking new policeman rookie in town who can't seem to stay away from Davey from the moment he laid eyes on her. Rock-hard abs, beautiful masculine body, piercing look...all a bit too cliche' but I was still okay with it. Ethan is a man of few words, yet the attraction towards one another is so tangible and strong that when Davey gets in trouble, Ethan is there to help her and protect her. And he is there when Davey is running away from the drug lord's henchmen who executed Palmer in cold blooded murder, or when she kills some federals and needs a place to hide.

What Davey doesn't know is that Ethan is not human. As the story unfolds, she learns that Ethan's human form died in a terrible crash, but his soul was forever embedded in a human-looking cyborg with impressive combat abilities by a brother unwilling to let his younger brother die. He used alchemy to harvest his brother's soul from afterlife and implanted into an android form which he was however unable to control.

It is for sure an interesting concept , but there were a couple of issues for me.

Let's do this quick and painless: I found it lacked in explanations, descriptions and information, not to mentioned that there was very little account for the characters feelings and emotions. Here we have the two main characters, Ethan and Davey, who go through hell and back throughout the entire novel, caught up in shootings, killings, beatings, fights, near rape, assaults and all sorts of drama and yet I can barely remember reading about their feelings, emotions and states of minds during those situations.

The transition between each scene was just too fast, I had to re-read some of the passages to make sure I hadn't involuntarily skipped a paragraph or two. And when I knew I didn't, I still needed a lot more explanation. Everything just happened way too fast, it felt like watching the teaser of a movie rather than the movie itself. And by the end of the book, things still haven't been explained fully.

This novel is romance, thriller and sci-fi all in one, and it is all too rushed... all except for the romance ..There was A LOT of romance and intimate scenes, all very specific and in-depth, but the sci-fi and thriller parts were barely delved into (the sci-fi one in particular).

Also I found the decision-making of the characters quite regrettable and inappropriate, not to mention nearly ridiculous at times.

It was confusing and puzzling as to why Davey felt the need of , and I quote, bury herself in him and was unable to stop herself from fornicating with Ethan whilst the drug lord's army of henchmen (who just killed Davey's ex boyfriend in cold blood murder with a bullet to his head) were on their trails. Or when the two decided to hide in a motel to escape the feds looking for them and the first thing that comes to their mind is of course to strip down and get to it. Or when Davey reckons the best way to revive an almost lifeless Ethan is to straddle him..

It was all a little frustrating. And whilst we got the specific details of their ..fornications..I felt like there wasn't much chemistry between the two, but just hormones. I enjoy romance in my reads, of course, and intimate scenes do not bother me one bit, but I only wished a bit less of it in this novel and a lot more details on the story surrounding Ethan's cyborg and human lives, again barely explained if not briefly at the end. I would have loved to read more on how Ethan came to be a cyborg.

Having said so, there are definitely good elements worth saving. The ending, for instance, is unexpected and pleasant. The plot and the idea behind it can be engaging and there is definite potential in the storyline. Only a bit more details and development would have done this book a world of good and would have gotten it an easy 4 stars from me. Such a shame.
