He seems to have a knack with dogs after he nursed a stray dubbed Rex. Rex also has a knack for knowing when Wes is getting mad—even before Wes himself knows sometimes.

Someone else has noticed Wes's knack with dogs and asked him to adopt a couple shelter dogs and train them for use in a nursing home. Things get complicated when Wes tries to visit his mom but isn't allowed to see her; and when the nursing home activities coordinator is not fond of dogs.

This was another great installment by Mackall. Just like the first, Runaway, I had a hard time putting this book down. Animal lovers will enjoy this series. This is a Christian series, though I did not find it overly preachy, the Christian message is definitely there.
