Jack Lemmon was one of our most beloved movie stars. A two-time Academy Award winner, he appeared in dozens of memorable films, including such classics as *Some Like It Hot*, *Mister Roberts*, *The Odd Couple*, *Grumpy Old Men*, *Missing*, *The Apartment*, and *The China Syndrome*. On-screen, he came across as a kind of "everyman"—audiences loved him because they felt they knew him, because he was on of them.

In *A Twist of Lemmon*, Chris Lemmon shares family tales, intimate father-son conversations, and anecdotes from and about his dad. The result is a vivid and enchanting portrait of a less-than-perfect father who in some ways assumed a greater reality for his fans than he did for his son. Chris writes about the difficulty of growing up in a broken home, the treasured time spent with his father, and the friendship that evolved as they came to share their passions for both music and golf. This very personal portrait provides new insight into a man who charmed millions with his rascal's smile and his very human vulnerability.

When Jack Lemmon died in 2001, the world lost one of its favorite actors, but Chris Lemmon lost the man he had admired above all others. *A Twist of Lemmon* is his warm and moving and often very funny celebration of his larger-than-life father.

Joining Chris in his tribute are a number of the people who worked with Jack Lemmon over the years, including actor Kevin Spacey. In his foreword, Spacey writes, "He was a credit to his profession because he was a man whose humanity was bigger than his talent. And when you think for a moment about the size and depth of that talent, then you begin to understand how seriously he took his role as a human being."

In this first book of its kind written about Jack Lemmon, that "human being" comes fully alive—as an actor, a father, and a best friend. It is a heartwarming and discerning look at a true American legend.

This was a very enjoyable read about one of my favorite actors of all time, Jack Lemmon, by his son Chris. This book is for men's men: golf, fishing, alcoholism, chasing women, craving one's father's approval, etc. It's full of funny anecdotes and a father-son theme that I confess was somewhat lost on me at times.

One criticism I have is the overuse of the name Lemmon (Lilac Lemmon, Lemmon Legacy, etc.) which oddly disenfranchises the female family members, even though it was clear that his father Jack in many ways had more of his mother's traits than his father's. The women are relegated to the role of furniture, not even supporting characters. Even the author's devotion to wife Gina is expressed in such over-the-top terms as to be both tender and completely unrealistic.

Still, it's a touching and tender tribute and above all funny and human life experience on paper.

The book could have incorporated more insights about Jack Lemmon's life as an actor, and less time about his outings as a father on fishing trips and golf tournaments. Too much time is consumed by a son trying to come to grips with a divorced dad who was his best friend yet not present much during his formative years.

There is no option for 3 1/2 stars on here, but that is more accurately what I'd rate this book. At times the sentimentality gets a little over the top--the author lays it on thick with constant talk of the "Lemmon Legacy"--but the anecdotes of life with Jack Lemmon as his dad are absolutely wonderful. Through countless stories, Chris Lemmon creates a vivid picture of his dad as a warm, kind, funny, imperfect, and very human individual. He paints a picture of a life well-lived and the moments he and his dad shared through the years. This is a book that will make you laugh and make you cry. Intermittently, we are given short scenes of Jack's final days in the hospital, and at the end of the book, his death from cancer, but thankfully, the majority of the book consists of anecdotal stories of the good times, many of which are downright hilarious.
