Cassandra was my favourite character from the previous book and she didn't disappoint in this one. After reading the first book in the series, I had high expectations for the second book which were fulfilled but in a different way than I expected. To know your way around this book, you need to have read the first one, A Job From Hell, otherwise I fear you won't know who everyone is. With the Shadows popping up halfway through and Aidan and Amber arriving in hell to tie in on the last book's ending, you're better off by pushing this one aside until you have read the first. This said, I thought this book was a great read. Very dark and gloomy but also funny in places. Cassandra's just like I would picture Lucifer's daughter, albeit without the need for torture. She's a nice girl with a bit of a bad girl's attitude. She's not afraid to embrace who she is but she's stubborn as a mule and doesn't want to. Dallas as a love interest was a strange choice. I would have expected to see someone stronger like Kieran in his place but I guess the ending wouldn't have worked if the writer picked someone else as her 'mate'.

Beelzebub Girl, the second book in the Ancient Legends series, did not disappoint, but I recommend readers to read the first book so they know why things must be happening this way and not take a different direction. I could imagine otherwise things might be too confusing since there's a love story but not a predictable ending per se.

In this book, Cassandra finds out she has a bond with a human- Dallas, but this is not the problem. As Lucifer's daughter she has more to fight against, more enemies, more obstacles placed in her path. With everything against her and her romance, Cassandra's running out of time. Literally.

It seems a love romance seems farther away, especially as she finds out she has a curse and she is supposed to take over the family business, even though she doesn't want to.

This wasn't your usual take on paranormal romance. It was a dark, gothic read with different paranormal elements such as reapers and fallen angels. I'm not one to sum up the plot because it's usually been done before, so I'll just focus on the various elements. This is certainly a well written, fast paced read, about 350 print pages long, with lots of action but also new paranormal elements. We have two vampires but they don't drink blood or avoid the sun, and we barely get to see them. The whole paranormal world focuses around hell and the demons as well as reapers and ghosts. We get a glimpse at the Shadows by the end, but not a deep one, so I suspect that's going to be dealt with in the next book.

I found Beelzebub Girl to be an entertaining read, quite dark and twisted in places. The romance part between Dallas and Cass was well developed and I could see the tension between them. This is clean Y/A, however, so you're not going to get hot action between the sheets. Nevertheless, I was thankful for that because too many young adults books out there try to imitate adult paranormal romance and it's just not right for teens and younger readers.

I liked Cass a lot, not least because she's feisty and comes with quite a bit of emotional baggage (her angel parents are separated, she finds it hard to find friends because everyone's scared of her and her father, her father doesn't approve of her dating a mortal etc.) She's not a quitter and I found myself lost in her world that at times she outshone even Dallas (her love interest). Don't get me wrong, he was great and sexy, but he paled compared to her and her aunts. The plot had quite a few twists and originality to it. Several times I thought I had the story figured out, until it turned in a different direction. The story is rounded up but there's also a cliffhanger ending leading into a sequel.

Definitely a different read and unusual for paranormal romance, and one that I enjoyed very much. If you

like darker fiction (not necessarily gore and blood because there's none of that in it, but a plot dealing with death, curses, dark magic, a new take on hell and demons etc.), this one is for you.
