Often the author would use the exact same "thesaurus adjective" two sentences in a row to describe different things. Similes and metaphors felt forced and painful to read. I honestly don't know why people would pay for all of these books (I read from for free through the library) because they are honestly probably the lowest quality books I have ever read.
