Captured when her latest hit goes horribly wrong, Theodora finds herself the prisoner of a strong, arrogant stranger. Soon enough, Theodora and Armand find their missions--and their hearts--entwined. But in their desperate attempt to save the world, will they be able to save each other?

The third installment of the Prometheus Project picks up right where book 2 ends, and this book focuses on the wraith, Theodora, who we met in Delilah and Rafe's story. The fallen angel this book focuses on is Armand, also known as Amorous, who we met in book one. He was one of the two angels that fell to the earth at the Mount Royal Circus. Armand is disheartened by what he has found on earth and regrets volunteering for his mission. He also does not want to kill anyone. He and his partner are tasked with killing the presidential candidate, Maxamillion Blackstone, and in order to accomplish this they go undercover at the Institute. While there, Armand and his partner thwart an assassination attempt against the Oracle by Theodora. Armand takes her hostage and away they go on their adventure. He gets Theodora to agree to kill Blackstone and they escape the Institute. Throughout their adventure the sparks fly and the trust build. The passion between the two is passionate and their love story is strong. I loved the epic culmination scene at the end when Theodora realizes that Armand decided to stay on earth to be with her.

I have enjoyed this series, is it set up so differently than other series. It has the traditional narrated scenes between the characters, but it also incorporates news bulletins, memos, historical documents complete with "sources" and "related articles". They were both really set in their ways of thinking until they met each other. Armand showed Theodora that she could trust, love and rely on others and through his strong faith, gave her hope. Theodora in turn showed Armand the true pleasures of being human and gave him a reason to fight. Both these characters are passionate and loyal to those they care about and in the end, they were two of my favorite characters from the series.

Rebel is the final chapter in the Prometheus Project trilogy. We see even more of the horrible ways the Shades are treated but the time finally comes for them to stand up and demand change. Third book in the series, and still holding my interest. I was initially attracted to the post-nuclear disaster setting, which reminded me of 'The Chrysalids' which I loved in school. The dystopian world is explored more fully in this installment, from the point of view of a voluntarily fallen angel (as in the first two installments) and a so-called wraith: a person who officially doesn't exist in the big-brother type Republic, but who uses the pervasive security and advanced technology of the world to her advantage.

Good: world-building, exploration of psychological and social consequences of class divisions based on genetic/physical health, neat gadgets

Not so good: Though several threads from the different books connected here, I had hoped for more description of what happened next / answered questions for some characters. Maybe this means that they will be further books in this universe? I thought this was intended as a trilogy, but perhaps loose ends may be tied up later. Such as

why a character in this technologically and medically advanced world would repeatedly ignore something as basic as contraception, with enormous consequences.

All in all, the unfolding action one three separate narration fronts meant suspense was most intense in this book of all the series so far.

Theodora lives outside of the system. Her passion - earning the “cred” she needs to keep those she cares about out of the hands of The Society. No matter the cost and trusting no one but herself. That all changes when she meets Armand.

He was different from other men she had known, fully equipped with an enviable moral code and a determination to keep his word. He was kind, a quality Theodora had never seen before in any human. She could trust him.

It is a volatile meeting for Armand and Theodora. Their conflicting agendas and diverse personalities clash at every turn. Even though Armand has lost his wings, he is still an angel in every moral sense. Whereas, Theodora believes in the power of “cred” and what it can buy if a person has enough of it. The growth of these two very powerful characters as they learn to let go and love is pure joy, but that is only one part of this delicious story.

Although listed primarily as paranormal romance, it has elements of sci-fi and urban fantasy. It didn't take me long to acquaint myself with this great world set in the year 2100. Ms. Delacroix did an incredible job of world building. I didn't have to read the first two in the Prometheus Project Trilogy to understand the terminology: words such as wraith and shade came naturally. I will admit this is a book I normally wouldn't pick-up in a bookstore as urban fantasy isn't my cup-o-tea, but I do enjoy a good sci-fi every now and then.
