Nathan has come to terms with his position of being a Reborn, but now more challenges present themselves. He wants to create a new New York Conclave, and topple the Council of Chains, but he can't do that alone. Dorian is still after him, and now someone is stealing dead bodies from the morgue. Add to that his arch enemy from a previous life who is out to get Nathan and the other half of his soul, and you have attacks on all sides. Then you can add in Elena...
