While this was an enjoyable way to while away a couple hours I wanted more out of it in a lot of ways. The characters were a tad one-dimensional to me. There was too much telling and not enough showing. I understood the characters but I didn't feel them and empathize with them. The hero was very sweet but also very naive. I loved the way he was with the heroine protective without being controlling. He genuinely cared for her and it showed in everything he did. The heroine had a pretty rough past but we only get the bare sketch of it very few details and none of the emotional impact that a flashback would give us. She had some understandable hang ups but she let go of them pretty easily which was a nice change from the normal angst of romance books. She was very caring but also very strong. Independent but not bitchy about it. I thought the two complemented each other very well. The romance was extremely well paced, especially for a short. I also loved the level of trust that these two had in each other, which was also a nice departure from most books. The sex scenes that were supposed to be the high point of the book though were oddly disappointing. To qualify this as any sort of BDSM just...it's inaccurate. I was excited to see the switch from the norm and have a femdom but....well there really was no domination here. They had some kink sure. Light restraints, a hint of anal, some teasing and delayed pleasure. But they switched control so this was not a true D/s relationship and honestly the kink fell short of anything that I'd label BDSM. Also the language just kind of ruined the heat for me..."vulva" should not be in a sex scene just...*shudders*. The plot, which I assumed would be the worst part, was definitely the highlight. It was actually really well developed and executed much to my surprise. A very adult take on Cinderella (strangely a theme I've been really into lately-adult versions of fairy tales), I liked that while it was very clearly a retelling but that it had its own spin on it so it wasn't just a boring remake. The writing overall was decent. There were awkward points but I didn't catch any typos.

Bottom line: a pleasant surprise in some ways and an unhappy disappointment in other ways. I genuinely enjoyed reading this but I don't think I'd read it again.

I was sent this book by Netgalley but that has no way influenced this review. This isn't a book I normally read but I was fed up of reading the same summaries and went in search for something I hadn't come across. I'm so glad I did because this was a great cute read, the BDSM is very light and if your looking for a hot

book this isn't the book for you. It was a cute romance that built over time and felt realistic to me, more realistic than most romance books I've come across.

Teodor was a sweet character whose heart was in the right place but perhaps hadn't had eyes opened in the way Mariella had. By getting to know her and falling in love his character grew into someone you'd happily marry.

*"I feel like a piece of meat
being haggled over at the market."
"A fate that befalls many women."*

*"Will you marry me, Mariella?"
She took a deep breath, looked
him in the eyes, and answered
truthfully, "No."*

He accepts her answer with little argument and only then to ask for her reasons. When she gives them he considers it from her point of view and agrees to a deal on her terms. Do have any idea how little I have seen this? It was a breath of fresh air and made me fall in love with the book.

*He said nothing, simply held her
hands in his and thought about what
she had said. Once he decided he
wanted her, he never imagined her
desires might not fit with his. Now
he was sitting with the only woman
he had ever considered marrying, and
she didn't want him or the life he
could offer her. He almost laughed
at the irony of his arrogance. During
their brief times together, he had
spoken of what he wanted and she had
listened to him. If he was going to
make this work, it was time to listen
to her.*

Mariella attends the ball in hopes of seducing a rich man into becoming her husband. She isn't looking for love but the security and escape from her family that he could give not only her but Finn as well. She fears romantic love because she has only seen it cause pain and can't bare the idea of going through that. She's more world wise than Teodor and has more experience in the bedroom but until she meets him hasn't had a pleasant experience in bed.

Now as much as I like that Cinderella's strength is her kindness it has always fallen a bit flat for me when it comes to what happens to her family who have been abusing her for years. In this one her kindness is shown both in her relationship to Teodor and also to Finn. When Teodor asks her what she wants done about her family she says that she wants them to be reduced to nothing. At her request Teodor has them imprisoned in and around their house so that they can't go further than the market and that their prospects are taken anyway. Since they were also at the balls looking for husbands this is a big thing for them and I felt a fitting punishment.

Finn was so cute, he was a small child who was also abused by Mariella's family and he was part of her driving force for wanting to get away. I greatly enjoyed his scenes and found him realistic.

I wanted to give this book 5 stars and I think the beginning is worth 5 stars but the end let it down ever so slightly. While I still enjoyed it there wasn't the five star feeling that the beginning had. Overall a wonderful read and one that I'm very glad I was sent as I wouldn't have been able to read it otherwise.

The Glass Stiletto is an adult version of the classic fairytale Cinderella, with a little bit of BDSM thrown in to spice things up. This is the first erotic fairytale I read and I wasn't 100% sure if I would like it, but I have to say it was a fun, lighthearted book that I enjoyed reading. It was pure escapism and a delight to read. Featuring a strong heroine who is determined to escape from her stepmother and cruel stepsisters, it is a romantic story that manages to be both sweet and spicy.

Mariella is husband hunting at the Royal balls, which Prince Teodor is hosting so he can search for his future wife. When they meet Teodor instantly falls for feisty Mariella, but she definitely doesn't want to be involved with a Prince. I enjoyed the couples meetings at the Royal balls and Teodor's subsequent search to find Mariella after she flees from the last ball leaving one of her glass slippers behind. Yes it isn't entirely believable, but this is a fairytale and they are meant to be fun and magical. Of course, as with all good fairytales, there is a villain who is determined to ensure that our hero and heroine don't get their happily ever after.

The Glass Stiletto is billed as a 'BDSM fairytale', but the BDSM content is very light and personally I'd have liked the author to take it further, but this is purely my personal preference. The BDSM scenes are mainly bondage (no impact play at all) so it makes it ideal for readers who prefer milder scenes and those new to the genre. The sex scenes are very sensual and steamy but are also very loving. Mariella and Teodor's chemistry is hot, and I loved how Mariella took charge in the bedroom as much for Teodor's benefit as for hers.

Overall I enjoyed this fun, sexy take on a classic fairytale and give it four out of five stars.

Fairy tales retold in an erotic manner are a guilty pleasure. The Glass Stiletto turns a well-loved children story into an adult sweet femdom delight. Those who know this story well, will be able to forgive the lack in degrading scenes between Mariella and her wicked step-family. This Cinderella doesn't depend on a fairy godmother. She is going to find a way out and it's by marrying a well off man who will be kind to her. What she isn't looking for, is more duty and less freedom. To her surprise, she catches the eye of Teodor, the Prince.

This story does bring in some fun twists and turns. It is not as gruesome as the original fairy tale nor as light as the Disney version. It does bring in a delicious taste of sugarkink with Mariella binding her up prince and riding him like a pony. The BDSM in here is so light which is why it is categorized as sugarkink. The femdom aspect of it is also a nice empowering twist. It's not the first Cinderella reboot with femdom, but it is certainly one of the more charming ones. Mariella is a good hearted kinky lover who entices her prince with an open heart. What more can a romantic femdom lover ask for?

The story moves at a nice easy pace. The villains are easily predictable just as they are hateful. The characters are a bit one dimensional. Teodor is surprisingly naïve to not research into all the men now working for him in a country he is going to take over as ruler. Mariella is a more timid than expected. Still, the two of them are cute together.

This story would be hotter if there were more intense femdom scenes between Mariella and Teodor. The punishment scene for Teodor gives a reader high hopes of sexual torment only to have it end up being a cock tease. More world building would have made this story richer. Perhaps it would be gratuitous sex to spend more time on Mariella's earlier years when she's been whored out and worked over hard as a slave. Still, being told her back history is not the same as experiencing the scenes through flashbacks. Allowing the reader to make the connections between the characters instead of being told them would also help make the story more interesting. For example, creating a scene where Mariella makes a connection between the Duke and her past would be more meaningful than just telling the reader about it. Overall, the story is enjoyable and a quick read.

This erotic romance is recommended for kinky fairy tale lovers who love happily ever afters.
