Charles Stanley is most known for his radio and television preaching on his "In Touch" program. He's the senior pastor at First Baptist Church of Atlanta, and has served as the president of the Southern Baptist Convention. So his pastoral wisdom has been forged in service to Christ's Church for over 50 years.

In this book, Stanley's pastoral voice takes a deeply moving and personal turn. Part spiritual autobiography and part spiritual theology, *The Spirit-Filled Life: Discover the Joy of Surrendeing to the Holy Spirit* is a beautifully simple, yet graciously instructive book.

The first part, "Looking Up", relates Dr Stanley's own struggles, as a seminary student and young, pastor. "I've known the pain and frustration of trying to live the Christian life by my own devices" (ix). To non-Christians, there appears so little difference to being Christian. And there's a reason according to Stanley: We try to live the impossible Christian life by our own power and processes. It won't work, which is why the Christian life is "the Spirit-filled life".

Sure, nobody's perfect. And, yes, God understands at our failed attempts. But those miss the point. We can't live the life to which God calls us in Jesus "apart from the help of the Holy Spirit" (10).

The first part of this book is an eye-opening experience. There's pain, but more importantly there's joy. Not because he's a pastor who's figured it all out. But because God's Spirit lives within him.

There's hope for all Christians to live this abundant, divinely-graced life in the Spirit.

"Looking Within", the second part of the book, highlights how this is a faith-full, hope-full word for all Christians. He rightly highlights the fruit of the Spirit over certain gifts (like speaking in tongues or healing). The work God has given us utilizes those nine virtues for a hurting world. His listing of the fruit of the Spirit on p. 123 opened my eyes. I've preached these often, but that list refreshed them by placing the mirror in front of me.

The final part, "Looking Ahead", opens up this life in the Spirit for our everyday lives. From peace to wisdom, from conscience to Scripture, God is still there, with us, in us, in Christ and the Spirit.

In all, this book is a simple, pastoral word. It's easy to read -- no theology classes necessary. And, even if there are points where we disagree (Stanley's premillennialism shines through), it's a real treat to disagree knowing our unity in Christ is forged not out of our agreements, but in this joyful Spirit-filled life.
