I've enjoyed novellas by Donna Hatch in the past but this is the first full-length novel I've read by the author. So good! The author really knows how to create a deliciously enticing setting in Regency England with deeply layered and endearing characters. The entire book takes place within a fortnight at a Christmas house party, which doesn't sound all that exciting at first, but excitement and secrets follow quickly as the story begins. Anyone who enjoys sweet Regency romance will enjoy this book.

It is a well-written novel with wonderful dialogue. The plot moves along quickly and the emotions of the characters really propel the story along without a dull moment. Some of the old English Christmas traditions were fun to read about. The author does an excellent job of creating her characters, layer by layer, and revealing their personalities to the reader; for, truly, the characters of this book truly make it shine.

Holly, a young lady yet to have her first London season, is well-bred, well-mannered, graceful, beautiful, soft-spoken, loving, compassionate, but unwilling to stand up for herself against her controlling mother. Her mother has her eye on an earl as her future husband. Will is a young vicar of noble background, struggling to forgive himself for his reckless youth and struggling even more to become the "respectable" vicar. He is on a quest to find a suitable bride. He is loyal, honorable, and dutiful, but also fun, vivacious, and charming. Their relationship starts off with a mistaken kiss and an unexpected physical attraction, but develops into something so much more. The romance is sweet and slow, as it needs to be during Regency era, but meets with much resistance since Holly's mother disapproves of Will and Holly so wishes to please her mother. Holly's mother is an interesting secondary character. Holly and her mother's relationship made me think about my own relationship with my daughters.

The theme of forgiveness is strong throughout the book, especially toward the end.
