ife can be pretty mundane for Dr. Alan Gregory, a psychology Dr. in Boulder Colorado. All of a sudden things have picked up tho. A young girl has tried to commit suicide and a cohort has called for him to come do an evaluation on her. Come to find out she's the sister of a little 2 year old who has been in the news for the past while, fighting for her life with a heart infection, but being rejected by the insurance company for a new heart. About the same time, Dr. Gregory goes to pick up his cop friend Sam at a murder site before taking him to Denver to the hockey game. Through the twists and turns of life Sam and Dr. Gregory figure out that the girl Gregory is treating is Sam's niece, AND the murdered person is the owner of the insurance company that is rejecting baby's heart transplant. Being's that this is Boulder, and reminders of little

JonBenet Ramsey's murder is still fresh in everyone's mind, this is getting to be sticky business. Toss in the fact that Sam's niece, the suicide teen, has bloody clothes and the gun used in the murder of the insurance guy in her bedroom...things don't look too good.
