This book was assigned for my drawing class. It's a very good book if you're wanting to draw things from observation (sketch or draw things that you see), or if you want to learn/work on shading and blending. If you're wanting to learn skills to draw things from your head, you may want to read another book, in addition to this one or in replacement of it. It doesn't teach things like 2-point perspective, or more than basic anatomy. There are a lot of good tips and tricks that can be gained from it for drawing people and animals, and some of the advice for facial feature placement is very useful. It taught me how to draw eyebrows decently, something I could never get the knack of before (hey, drawing a good eyebrow is hard!).

It's not a very difficult or advanced book so I would recommend it to someone beginning at drawing.

In my opinion, Lee Hammond could teach a little more technique in her books, before moving on to the more difficult elements. It is very hard to explain well enough through writing; it is much easier to have an actual lesson with Hammond or see videos of her drawing. So, I understand how she feels.

This book has basically everything from drawing ears to flower petals, to full portraits, to cat's noses. The step-by-step sketches are very helpful, and precise. One of the best sections in this book are the clothes. Accessories and clothing can be difficult to draw, especially getting that 3-D form and texture. But Lee Hammond makes it look simple!

I also like how Hammond gives tips on how to properly do toning and shading. Using a tortillion (which Hammond suggests to use) makes it easier to blend, and create amazing shading-- now I don't have to worry as much about that!

Even though it may be considered cheating, tortillions are very useful tools. In school, our art teacher says that eventually, we'll have to learn to use our pencils to blend well enough. But if you just don't have the time or experience, then a tortillion would be a good addition to your art supplies!

Anyone who wants to draw well should buy this book, and learn to draw REALISTICALLY! In no time, you'll be sketching portraits in a few minutes...
