With that in mind and such a great synopsis that caught my attention I had a feeling this would be a good story. But what really sold me was this quote...

"Five years of celibacy. Hell, maybe longer. And one fling, just one in five years, and she was pregnant with no husband or boyfriend in sight."

Five years of celibacy? There's something I could seriously relate to. I once went 6 years after a bad breakup so right away I could get into the head-space of the Heroine, Jessalyn. So you go five years (or more) with no sex and a surprise baby is bound to happen when you finally open the flood gates. You're on a cruise ship, alcohol is flowing and in walks a sexy muscular hunk of man meat and sh-- gets real, fast! You have three fun filled nights and when the lust clears you're left with a baby and you don't even know his last name so you have no way of finding him to let him know. Happens all the time right? The characters in this one were spectacular. Despite their severe lapse in judgement in having unprotected sex without knowing anything about the other person, they were a great couple I felt belonged with each other. Jessalyn was a strong and independent heroine who has worked from the ground up to create a business to be able to work from home and still support herself. Even though she was 35 and single she chose to keep the baby and raise it solo. I admire women like that because my mother was a strong single mother. The loss of her father and later her brother left her with just her mother as her only family tie so it was equally heart warming with the addition of the baby to add more love to her life. Despite my hatred of guys who go through women just because they have a penis and it fits in every slot, I found myself adoring Sam. Yes, he was a big ladies man and didn't have any intentions of settling down because he loved his job and the excitement of a different chick on rotation, Sam was actually a decent guy.
