Where is the first book to this series? I've now read BOTH of the books in this series and I'm thinking the author forgot something...the first book. Rosemary is a some type of Succubus who needs seven men to feed her. She also need to have one Prince. She has a slight problem, her mother wants her dead.

This story is really like a mix of Sunny's Mona Lisa Series plus Snow White. Although, to be fair, Sunny's book is a rip off of Anne Bishop's Dark Jewel series combined with aspects of LKH's Anita Blake books. If you've read all three of these series plus the story of Snow White, perhaps this book will be much easier for you to understand.

The similarities of Snow White are:

1. The seven men which is the same number of dwarfs
2. The dress (laced stays)
3. The comb
4. The golden apple

It's similar to the Mona Lisa series because of the need to feed off of men who make her nest. Plus there is always a consort. Although to be fair, every fairy tale has a consort.

The first half of the book was unreadable for me. I nearly put it down as DNF and a 1 star. I honestly couldn't get any of the men straight other than Kurt and the "Prince". They all felt kind of the same to me. Yes, some of them were more sub than Dom. And they had different jobs and different supernatural powers, but none of them were developed in a manner that I could separate them out as individual beings. They were just dicks to be fucked and sucked.

The sex scenes were interesting. The bit of D/s was tasty. It's really the last maybe 1/4 of the book where it became more interesting and I enjoyed it. The last 1/4 of the book saved it for me and I wish there was more to this world. As a first debut book to show how more than three men can be devoted to one woman, I'd say Ms. Sommerland accomplished her goal.

Improvement points I'd recommend would be - more clarity and world building up front. Do the humans know about all these supernatural beings? My guess is not. How many different supernatural beings are there and how to they relate? How does a nest exactly function? I understand a lot of it was hit or miss because Rosemary is learning, but it's implied that someone is teaching them and it's never said who is doing it. There's only a mention of Kurt indicating that the men have been lax. What is the function of these nests? What do the territories entail? What is this other group that don't like Rosemary's existence? There are many pieces to this world which seems to be in the author's head rather than in the book. This makes it hard for the reader to enjoy it. Especially when the book ends and all the same questions remain.

Overall, I still enjoyed the book because the ending piece was good for me. This is why it is a 2.5 star. I recommend this to kinky paranormal readers who have read the books I've mentioned BEFORE reading this one.

Rosemary would look like a very loose woman to anyone who knew she shared her bed with several men, but they don't know the half of it. She has to have sex, and the only way to get it is to take it from those who understand her need. If she stuck with one man, the poor guy would be exhausted, and as the men she shares her bed and life with know why she's the way she is, it works for them all.

She has different feelings for each man, and I enjoyed wondering how that would work out for real. What if you had more real emotions towards one or two men than the others? What about jealousy? What if, despite trying to keep feelings out of it, they came anyway? Rosemary has to deal with all of this and more, and I felt for the woman. It isn't her fault she needs sex as much as she does!

As expected with so many men in the book, there are enough sex scenes in Rosemary Entwined to satisfy the greatest appetite, but don't be fooled into thinking it's all sex and no story. That seriously isn't the case, and as the book moves along at a great clip, things are revealed that push Rosemary to make choices that she'd rather not entertain....

I received a free copy of this book to read and review for Wicked Reads.

I am a huge fan of Ms. Sommerland's Dartmouth Cobras series and have enjoyed every book, novella, and story of hers that I have read. Sadly, I never got around to buying a copy of *Rosemary Entwined* before she unpublished it. So you can imagine my excitement when offered the chance to review the book for its re-release. Yep, I jumped at it, not caring that I really didn't have time to read it – but sleep is overrated and comes second to a good book. As expected, Ms. Sommerland did not make me regret my decision to forego a few hours of sleep for a stellar read.

Rosemary Entwined is a paranormal romance that puts one heck of an erotic twist on the story of Snow White. While I typically don't enjoy the "adult" retelling of a childhood fairytale, this book is really more of

an adaptation than a retelling of the story. Rosemary is a succubus (along with some other royal paranormal bloodlines) and must maintain a nest of six men plus her prince in order to survive. Her mother, the Queen, is trying to kill her to keep Rosemary from taking over her nest and usurping her – and because she is the fairest of them all. So you see the Snow White parallels? There are a couple more parallels, but that's about as far as it goes because Snow White wasn't a succubus who had to feed on the men from her nest in order to live and to keep them alive. As for Rosemary's men, well we learn that Rosemary isn't the only one who's not human and this a good thing when dealing with her insatiable hunger and attempts on her life.

I really enjoyed *Rosemary Entwined*. I liked that the author stayed true to the succubus nature and used it to provide multiple MF and MFM sex scenes as Rosemary fed from her men. The intensity of the scenes increased as Rosemary's powers grew and she was able to "share" the energy from the feedings with all the men rather than just those in her immediate company. While I knew that I would enjoy the author's writing, I really liked how she was able to take an idea from a fairytale and, rather than simply giving an adult retelling of it, Ms. Sommerland gives us a seriously hot book inspired by Snow White. A strange but satisfying book from a writer who doesn't balk at pushing the boundaries. Rosemary doesn't seem to be your average college student as she has 7 lovers, all who seem to be happy sharing her. She loves them each in their own way, and their personalities all become distinct as the story progresses, demonstrating how bound up in each others lives they are. Hints are dropped that Rosemary has some special strange powers and the story begins to unfold.

Rosemary is a cambion – a succubus-cross-breed – and needs to have a 'nest' of men to support and 'feed' her. She thinks her nest is complete, but it becomes apparent that it needs a Prince to complement and strengthen it, in order to resist potentially fatal attacks from her biggest rival, her jealous mother.

In order to take a Prince, she needs to release one of her current nest and this will be a heartbreaking decision to make. For if she doesn't take this step, she puts her entire nest at risk – if she dies, her nest will die along with her.

Writing a book with 7 lovers gives plenty of opportunity for erotic action and the sex in this book was as hot as you expect any Bianca Sommerland to be, but balanced with tenderness and musing. In other writers hands this could have turned into a tacky romp, but not here. Ultimately though, I felt the first half was a little slow, mainly with the need to establish so many separate characters and I didn't really feel gripped and engaged until half way through.
