The Lord's Captive: Border Series Book 2 (Volume 2) by Cecelia Mecca is another interesting and compelling Medieval Romance. I feel it can easily be read as a stand alone.

The Lord's Captive is the second book in The Border Series by Cecelia Mecca. It can easily be read as a stand alone book, but having read the first in the series, The Thief's Countess, I knew more of the background of the story and characters, and it only added to my enjoyment of this book.

Sir Bryce Waryn, his brother Geoffrey, and their Uncle Hugh have spent the last 5 years doing all they could to raise an army to take back their castle and lands that they had taken from them. The Scottish Kerr clan believed as a border property between England and Scotland, they had a right to it. During the upheaval Bryce's parents were murdered, and he vowed to get revenge from that day. He would get back his home and he would kill the clan leader.

Finally after all their planning, Bryce and his army win back their holdings, and Bryce becomes the Lord of Bristol Castle. A title that would have gone to his elder brother, but he wanted Bryce to have it as he was married and living elsewhere meaning he couldn't be a good Lord of the land. Bryce should be celebrating, but instead immediately after the battle he is left in a dilemma after his men find a terribly injured woman near the river and bring her back to the castle to be looked after. The dilemma being that she is the sister of the men who murdered his father. She is a Kerr. Having her there meant for definite that sooner rather than

later the Kerr clan would attack again in order to free her. Of course that is if he didn't come up with a way to stop that happening. He decides he will write to her brother and offer her freedom for a ransom. In the mean time the healer must deal with her and get her well.

Lady Catrina Kerr is the hostage in question. Although she is being held captive she admits, if only to herself that her captor is not only the most stubborn man she's ever met, but he is also very very attractive. Once she is well she knows she must escape the castle so that her brothers and the army don't come after her. There has been enough blood shed, and she wants no more.

Bryce finds Catrina maddening, and like no other woman he knows, she can fight, she wears breeches, and she definitely speaks her mind. She is also stunningly beautiful and when Bryce should be hating her for being a Kerr, he battles constantly with the need to pull her into his arms and kiss her.

Can a relationship ever develop between them, even if Catrina wasn't a Kerr, she's been betrothed for years and it wouldn't be something she could easily get out of. How can Bryce have his revenge knowing Catrina would never forgive him? How can he keep from fighting her clan when they will always want to take back Bristol Castle believing they have the rights to it? There are so many reasons that Catrina and Bryce shouldn't be an 'item' but the overwhelming lust they feel for each other the more time they spend together has them both trying to figure out ways they could possibly be together. In the mean time, they can't help but fight their passionate natures and give in at least to some of their needs.

This is an amazing story, not only of lust/love between our hero and heroine, and boy oh boy were the passionate scenes between them sizzling hot, but it's one of family loyalties, and of the fight between Catrina and Bryce's hearts and heads. This book was just not for me. While I could obviously tell by the title what the plot of the book was going to be before I read it, for some reason I was hoping it find a way for it *not* be creepy. Well, on that account it failed. It was super creepy. Warning: Slightly rant-y.

This book begins right about when the last book left off. Bristol Manor has finally been taken back from the Kerr's and Geoffrey has given his brother Bryce (the hero) Bristol Manor. During the raid, Bryce and his men discover a woman face down, clearly injured, possibly close to death. Bryce actually wants to just leave her there, even without knowing who she was, which I found a little off-putting, but he eventually agrees to take her back to Bristol Manor and have her looked at by a healer. Bryce discovers that she is Lady Catrina Kerr and of course decides to keep her for ransom. Somewhere along the way, they fall in love.

Here begins said rant.

There was just so much about this book I didn't like. For one, I wasn't really a fan of the instant attraction between Bryce and Katrina. Especially from her. She was instantly in lust with him and I found it ridiculous. There are actual scenarios that I could see that happening. Plenty of them. Maybe her captor could have been kind and told her that she is only captive in name and set her up a nice guest room. Perhaps while explaining that he hates everything she is, he doesn't blame *her* for everything, but he still needs the ransom. Maybe he could have just ignored her and slowly seen what an actually nice person she was. But none of that took place. He immediately makes it clear that he hates her, she is his prisoner, he wants to take all of what her brother has, that he also intends to kill her brother, and he will keep her captive for however long it takes to get what he wants. And yet, she just can't help but think how handsome he is and wonders why he never smiles. Granted there isn't much she can do about her situation, but come on. I was hoping she would muster up a little more than an occasional *what an insufferable man* attitude. It didn't even matter when he locked in a room for days. When she saw Bryce all she could think about was how handsome he was and the way his muscles moved beneath his clothes. I wanted to reach into the book and throttle the woman. She does try to escape, but the fact that her escape was so poorly planned didn't help my opinion of her.

I found Bryce so hard to like. He was judgmental, rude, unpleasant, angry, and he just seemed...miserable. Then again, Catrina really wasn't a picnic either. She was careless, inconsistent, naive and at one point, incredibly manipulative. She wasn't a bad person by any means, but I found it hard to sympathize with her.

The fact that I found the MCs unlikable isn't *that* big of a deal. It happens. Not every character can be a giant ball of sunshine. But it was what happened near the end of the book that *really* bothered me. I absolutely cannot believe that all of the people around Lady Catrina, including Bryce's family, encouraged her to trap Bryce into marrying her. They insisted that was the best thing to do for Bryce. Catrina just kind of shrugged and says "Okay, I mean, I do love him after all." Because of course. The fact that you love him and that his family seems sure that he's into you totally makes it okay for you to try and take advantage of his honor and force him into a marriage that would connect him to a family he despises and blames for the death of his parents and bind him to a woman that he has not said he loves. This sounds like a sound plan. This sounds like a reasonable thing to do.

Being trapped into marriage is a well-explored trope in romance, I get that. But I'd like to think that it usually takes place before one character clearly explains to the other that they do not want the marriage. I don't really care if they mean what they say. It's one thing to try to convince them otherwise, it is completely another decide whether you should actively attempt (or actually decide) to take the choice away after someone's decision has been made.

I can't really decide if the next part of my rant is an actual spoiler or not, so I'm going to hide it. Personally, I don't think it's a spoiler but who knows, maybe I'm wrong.

Despite my obvious dislike of many parts of the book, there was one thing that I really liked and it was something I've been waiting to see in a romance novel forever. The fact that heroine can do **everything** is actually remarked upon. She was known for it. Everyone who knows Catrina acknowledges and applauds the way that she seems to be good at everything she tries. A jack of all trades. There are people like that. It happens! I've always wondered why authors don't just work that into the novel as part of the characterization. It made such a difference because it completely took away any frustration over the fact that she was amazing at everything.
