A smoking-hot firefighter with ice-blue eyes, or a mysterious cop...what's a girl to do? Pansy has the answer: refuse to choose and savor the consequences of both men pursuing her. Does she expect her lovers to play fair? Oh, no. She's hoping they'll play dirty. Real dirty...

Thoughts: The warning says it all: this romance is not for the faint of heart. The book is really graphic and explicit, so if that's not your thing, this is not your book. With that being said, I really wanted to like this book....the blurb sounded really great, and I had high expectations. However, I did have a few issues with it.

My main problem with it was the lack of an actual storyline. The book was really nothing but gratuitous sex. While I do enjoy erotic novels with graphic sex scenes on occasion, I require at least a semblance of a storyline. There was a potential for a that here, but it just wasn't executed throughout the book. And some ideals just didn't mesh with me. For example, Beau has supposedly been wanting Pansy for months, yet he never acts on it until someone else shows an interest in her. And Pansy supposedly wanted Beau – has been waiting months for him to "notice" her – yet when he does show his interest in her, her attention has switched to include a man she has just met! For most people, when the person they have been longing after for months finally sits up and takes notice – they really don't notice anyone else.

The end came up rather abruptly, and left me rather dissatisfied with the inner working of this threesome they now found themselves engaged in. For me, it felt rather like someone had taken out the steamiest, most erotic parts of the story and skipped out on the beginning and most of the end. I also wanted the characters to be a little more fully developed, and easier to become engaged with emotionally. I wasn't eagerly awaiting the end of the book, but I just wanted there to be more to it.

Pansy is a woman who owns her sexuality and desire to be submissive. Beau is a dom through and through and doesn't apologize for his lifestyle choices. Billy wants Pansy but is not a dom. Both men want Pansy and she wants both men. The sticky wicket is that neither man is bisexual nor do they have any interest in trying a relationship with each other.

I felt strongly that Beau's change of heart about including Billy in his relationship with Pansy was way to quick without enough substance. Or on the flip side, if he is going to stare at Billy with interest then I would have thought he would act on the attraction because he is so sexually aware.

Another thing that really bothered me was that Pansy was initiated into the group of friends when Beau brought her in but Billy wasn't. It might seem like a minor point but Beau is definitely in control of this relationship. He allows Pansy to be initiated without asking her about her comfort level and her desires. She is uncomfortable with some of what is done. That is not a healthy start to a relationship in my mind.

As I indicated, I enjoyed the story when I let go and just let it happen. The writing style is smooth and easy to read. I plan to read the final book in the series just to see how it ends. And maybe this trio will be a true trio in the end.
