Christmas in Mustang County looked cute and sweet when I read the blurb and it definitely lived up to my expectations even though I am nowhere near ready for the Christmas season to begin.

There's nothing exciting, nothing high-powered and certainly not a place for her to apply her advertising degree. But it does have certain charms to it. The friends she grew up with, cozy little stories and, now, Jaxon.

Jaxon tolerated the big city but, when he got the call to go back to Idaho, he was concerned for his father but excited to return to the wide open spaces, blue skies and the animals that he loved. His biggest regret was leaving Charlie. He tried to convince her that she should give it a chance, give him a chance but she wouldn't. Stalking her FB page, he finds out that she's going back to Mustang Creek. He doesn't know if she is there to stay but it is worth moving there and taking the job offer from his friend to help out at his Veterinary Clinic.

A little bit of magic, a lot of meddling from the adorable Mrs. Klozz, the love of animals, a secluded cabin and a sleigh ride were all working against Charlotte and definitely in favor of Jax. He never stopped caring for Charlotte so after his father returned to work, Jaxon eagerly accepted a job offer to join a vet practice in Mustang Creek. He was even more thrilled to discover that Charlotte was returning home and he is cautiously optimistic they can resume their relationship.

Charlotte returns to Mustang Creek with no clear plan for her future. She loves her career but she is torn between staying close to her beloved Aunt Geneva and moving to another large city where she can put her skills to use. She is stunned to discover that Jaxon is planning to settle in her hometown, but she still sees no way around their conflicting dreams. With a little help from the mysterious Mrs. Klozz, Aunt Geneva and a surprising business idea, Jaxon eagerly begins trying to convince Charlotte to give their relationship a second chance.

Christmas in Mustang Creek is another low key, blissfully angst-free romance from fan favorite **Linda Lael Miller**. As always, the characters are quite appealing, delightfully engaging and beautifully developed. Some fun and frolics as you'd expect with good location detail including having to care for the horses on Christmas Day. I was a bit surprised that our heroine doesn't start inquiries about running websites, accountancy or marketing for town businesses as she just seems to be in a slump. Surely the benefit of getting experience is to put it to good use and spread the skills around, not to call yourself unemployable in a recession. Maybe she is just depressed and leaving work issues until after Christmas. This is an adult romance tale.

There's a bit too much of a fanciful character named Mrs Klozz who is baking cookies every time we meet her and organising everyone's life; this is clearly suggesting a magical involvement and it's odd that in a small town nobody seems to care who her people are or where she grew up. I think the author was just having some fun. Still, the spiced gingerbread sounds nice.

Jax is, of course, sweet and chivalrous and offers to share the room with her. The sparks are still there between them, but Jax is determined not to rush things and maintains his distance. Charlie isn't sure what to think, other than the need to keep herself under control.

The next day, Charlie meets the mysterious Mrs. Klozz, who knows far more about Charlie than Charlie knows about her. Mrs. Klozz also seems to have a knack for knowing just what Charlie is thinking or needs. While Charlie is off to the assisted living center to see her aunt, Mrs. Klozz manages to get Jax to the house and invites him to stay there while looking for a place to live. Of course, he knows that Charlie isn't going to be thrilled with the idea, but he's willing to see how it plays out. He was right, but Charlie finds herself succumbing to Mrs. Klozz's gentle bulldozer tactics.

Mrs. Klozz is quite the matchmaker and finds any number of ways to throw Charlie and Jax together.
