Rachel has had a thing for the Jackson brothers since she moved to Desire and she can't understand why they won't follow through on the heated looks that they throw her way. With a push from the overly helpful citizens of Desire the three come together in a blaze of passion that should have burned the town to the ground. But the boys fear rears its head and they handle the morning after poorly. When they find out that Rachel is pregnant they come back determined to win her over and take care of her and the child. Rachel isn't convinced that they love her and nothing seems to help in that regard not even having her sister Erin harassing Rachel on a daily basis.
