One word that comes to my mind when I think about this novella: sinister. About the Characters...

I was intrigued by the blurb on this novella and mistakenly thought that I was reading a prequel to a series when really I was reading a book somewhere in the middle. My mistake didn't cost me thankfully as the story didn't reference anything, but the immediate character's pasts.

The story begins when a lonely female vampire determines that a priest is her fated mate (granted she was high at the time). She visits his midnight mass for months and continues to like what she sees. The priest is torn between liking what he sees and following his calling. But in the work of one night, Angeline, enthralls her priest, Hadrian and makes him vampire thinking to make him her own, but Hadrian is more than he seems. He comes through the transformation not a bloodthirsty monster held in Angeline's control, but a sentient being with his own plans. Hadrian is determined to retain the good in himself even if Angeline's actions took his life and forced him to start anew.

In truth this one is a prequel of sorts because it introduces the dark, tortured Angeline and the strong good Hadrian, but leaves things very open at the end for what is to come next. It has a gothic tone to it and is devoid of romance with just the physical attraction between Angeline and Hadrian. There is the presence of another being that will probably get her own story later too.

This one should be thought of as a teaser or introduction more than a complete story. I'm intrigued enough to want to go back and begin at the beginning with this series and work my way through.

Dark Mercy marks the first Vampire book I have read in over 15 years. Being a fan of Anne Rice I have not found another author who could write a sophisticated Vampire who drew me in enough to read a chapter, let alone a full book.

The words Dichotomy and Etymology come to mind instantly with this story; Angeline whose name means "Angel" and Father Hadrian whose name means "Dark One" is just one example. Dark Mercy is a quick read, but one that is packed full of page turning greatness. *Dark Mercy* introduces us to Angeline, half demon half human, and Hadrian, a human priest that Angeline has set her eyes and heart on. Later on we are also introduced to Tamara who also plays a key role in this duos story.

I knew going into *Dark Mercy* that it was going to be a short story, and as the author points out, wont end with a 'Happy Ever After'. But even after all of this i still found myself enjoying *Dark Mercy* and wanted to find out what was going to happen, not only to Angeline, but also Hadrian. When a new character, Tamara, is brought into the mix it was interesting how she reacted to Hadrian and Angeline. The characters were realistic and the description used to describe not only their mannerisms, but also the city these event take place made it easy to imagine everything that was going on.

When the story progresses we get to see a different side to both characters. I'm tempted to say short and sweet, except it's not quite sweet, this is more of a bada\$\$ read. Short and dark, definitely. I'm all for dark generally, as you know.

For me this read split into two different parts, basically. The first half or so of it was, for me, a 5/5 read. Great tone, vivid writing, lovely imagery and scene building, it was all awesome. The second part of it was, for some reason, less entertaining despite the fact the real pulp of it if you will is exactly in that part of the read. The turning point was probably the altar scene, and I'm not commenting any further so I won't spoil your read when you give this a try. Sufficient to say if you're sensitive about church stuff, you shouldn't really read this, that's my honest opinion.

As you guys know, I'm not a church fan or anything, not a religious zealot or whatever for any religion. I'm big on God, not big at all on church. I generally dislike any religious content in any reads, I just don't roll with it well. This is a clear part of my Review Policy for a reason. But I was willing to give this a try despite that, just because of that awesome start. Despite my reluctance, it wasn't the church related content that triggered my wavering interest, but the nature of the chemistry between Hadrian and Angeline. It was really awesome chemistry for the first half or so of the read, I was basically riveted. But then when they actually began to interact it lost me.

I really liked Angeline as a POV, however Hadrian was not doing anything for me for a while there, and towards the end there he began to actually step on my nerves. I guess for some he'll be this really hardcore vigilante sort of churchy dude, I don't know. To me he read somewhat extreme and not in the good way. I think Hadrian is the sort of wildcard character, you're either going to totally be Team Hadrian or sort of dislike him as the read goes on, like it happened to me. It's not the fact that he became sort of hardcore that had me losing interest, but the way he exercised his new found strength. I can't really talk about this more or I'll give you spoilers, I'm just saying that Hadrian was cool for me up to the "worthy or not" point. That's where he lost me completely.

Overall the writing was good, though as a personal preference jumping POV is not that hot. It's more insightful, I know, but it can backfire, and it sort of did for me here. But if you like vampire stories, dark (to sinister) reads and some churchy-flavored things mixed in your reads, including worth-of-saving vigilantes sort of hints, then this will be a treat.

This novella is the introduction to a couple of vampires - drawn to one another - who become enemies. However, they were not always vampires.

Angeline fell for and seduced a priest. A hot priest, of course :) However, this holy man turned the tables on her plans to 'turn' him into her vampire lover, so that he was not to be the darling, submissive and loving pet, she'd longed for. Cleverly, he flipped a magical switch and although he was originally drawn to her sexually,

he saw things quite differently once he'd returned from the clutches of death, a 'new' vampire, holy-man.

He set about his plan of vengeance on Angeline, and of righteous pay-back on the sinful in his community. Once a useless 'man-of-the-cloth' without power to change things, now a holy, sin-kicking vampire with a cause: to rid the planet of those who will not repent, while brainwashing those who wish to repent, into living better lives. I enjoyed this twist. Certainly, it is original to my knowledge. Apart from Priest: The Movie (but that was different - check my review [here](#)). The Priest was a rebel and an ass-kicking dude, but he was a vampire slayer - clearly not the same.

I imagine if you're especially religious you may not enjoy this angle of the story. You've been warned :)

There was another much more interesting character I should mention - a strange and magical being who longs to die before another demon can kill her for her power, and use it in awful ways. Trouble is, no one but this demon seems strong enough to fully end her immortality. She was sad, sorrowful, but also radiated the strength of millennia.

So, for the heartbroken vampiress who lost her loving holy-man, the righteous preacher who has scores to settle, and for the sweet child lost in lingering life and pursued by a power-hungry demon on his path to destruction - Cheers Zoe. :)

Where I felt things let me down is more difficult to tell. I wanted to feel more attached to the characters, more invested in the romance, than I was. Nevertheless, this is only a novella and I think she packed in a lot of information and weaved a full web in such a short book, already. There was little room for more.
