Another enjoyable DS9 novella. It was fun to read a detective story's from Odo's point of view, and Quark is amusing as always. I hope the author's are allowed to continue with these short novels well into the future.

A fun, noir-inspired mystery romp featuring our favourite DS9 Constable and his best frenemy. When Quark goes missing on Ferenginar, Odo (who's recently devoured Chief O'Brien's collection of Mike Hammer novels) travels there to investigate. All the classic noir mystery character types are represented and Odo fills the hard-boiled detective role perfectly.

Interestingly, the plot is underlined by Grand Nagus Rom's social reforms, which enable women to inherit their husbands' property. I would've liked to see more from Ishka or Leeta (or Pel!) to show another side of women on Ferenginar than what we got.

Overall, a really enjoyable, quick read, especially if you're a fan of both Trek and detective fiction.
