This was just one very painful read. This is a 160 page read of a woman who only wants to be abused. She allows her brother to abuse her, and then she gets tangled with the hero..who basically uses her to avenge a crime her brother committed against his family. There is something very distinct and elegant about Caitlin Crews' writing that appeals to me. I noticed that in her first book for HP, Pure Princess, Bartered Bride, and it was evident here as well. I liked the strength of her heroine in Tristanne. She was afraid, she was wounded emotionally, but she was strong! She approached a very dangerous man and offered to be his mistress, for the sake of her mother. And that's not the end of her troubles, because she's gone from the frying pan to the fire. Nikos Katrakis is not easy to manipulate into a fake arrangement as she planned. He's the kind of man who gets exactly what he wants, and he has plans for her and for revenge on her family. Nevertheless, she ends up falling into his bed and in love with him.

Although I feel that this story could have had more dialogue (it's almost entirely introspective thoughts and description), it was still exciting and intriguing, what a good Harlequin Presents should be. Crews has a great way of writing the exquisite tension between her characters where I was holding my breath in anticipation. Also expectantly waiting to see what will happen next. I didn't believe that Nikos would go through with his ruthless, cold-blooded plan for revenge. When he does, my heart sank. I sorted through my own emotions and wondered if Tristanne could forgive him. I have to say that the scene in which they reunite really threw

me. Tristanne shows what love truly is. Instead of plunging the knife that Nikos hands her into his black heart and twisting it, she forgives him. Because she loves him. Because she sees that this man didn't know what love was. And it was her job to teach him.

This story is quite different from Caitlin Crews' first HP novel, and I really liked it for its difference, although the first is still my favorite. I liked the intense emotions and the very admirable, mature, self-sacrificing, but painfully self-aware heroine. I liked the blazing hot passion between Tristanne and Nikos. And I loved how Ms. Crews took the standard self-made, ruthless HP tycoon, and gave me a tortured, hurting man who had been used and hated by everyone who should have loved him. She took this character and put him into the hands of the perfect heroine to show him what it meant to love and to be loved in return. It makes me think of Nature Boy by David Bowie

Typical HP story but what is not typical is how this novel almost has it all: strong and likable H/heroine, excellent dialogue, steamy sensuality, humor/wit, good pace/storytelling, and picturesque backgrounds.

Up to the last 20% of the book, this was gonna be 5 Stars but it really took a dive. Not only did the heroine forgave the H too easily IMO but unless I blinked, the H didn't technically say ILY. Very emotionally unsatisfying.

Nikos Katrakis HATES Tristanne Barbery family for a wrong he believes the committed against his family. He has been planning his vengeance but it isn't too overt. It is subtle and when the opportunity presents itself in the form of Tristanne, Nikos isn't adverse in using her as the tool to gain his vengeance. Tristanne will do anything to help her helpless mother. With her mother's mounting health bills and Tristanne not having a job that can support both her and her mother, she must cower to her step brother. However, Tristanne finds that Nikos may be a bit more appealing in helping her to achieve that goal of her trust fund three years before,

rather than whomever darling step brother picks for her.

First off this mysterious illness of Tristanne's mom – what was it? Next, I could NOT understand why Nikos wanted revenge for those people. He seemed to have wanted something from them that they were unable to give. However, the icing on the cake is that he claimed he didn't know what love is. Makes sense as to why he doesn't express it much. UNTIL you recall that he claimed he loved his half sister!!!! He even thinks he could not and did not know what love is – therefore he wouldn't know it if he felt it. Again note that he claimed it for half sister – he knew! More than likely it is a case of him not being able to accept love, but he can extend it to those that hate him.

Nikos seemed to develop some rage at the evidence of her step-brother's marks on her yet he still left her to him!!! I almost wished that she got smacked around a bit just to squeeze something out of cold H. Nikos even wanted to leave scars when he gets his final revenge. He was just way too cold for me. All Nikos did was lie and make promises to Tristanne that he had NO intention of keeping. However, w/ nasty half-sister he claimed honor?!

This whole blame thing that Nikos had for Tristanne's family didn't seem completely resolved IMHO. The half-sister excuse mad a little sense, but the business deal sounded like Nikos was just as much at fault. Why would Tristanne's step-brother lie about that especially then? Nikos on the other hand has proven that he will lie to get what he wants. Even Nikos' half-sister claimed that it was Nikos' fault as well.

Near the end, Tristanne is thinking that she can't trust Nikos and that his reaction to something she said to him should be a clue as well. But for some reason she is doomed because she can't seem to get away from him. She didn't want a life like her parents where her mother begged for scraps of affection from her father even though he took responsibility for her. Tristanne seemed so strong and I expected more at the end, I wanted more at the end not just ILY from him, but MORE!!! Even though Tristanne claimed she was hurt by what Nikos did to her, she gave in way to easily and it seemed that the theme was unconditional love w/ no consequences! Nikos claims he doesn't wallow and yet his words to Tristanne in the end sound a bit like it to me.
