4.5 stars - This was an awesome collection of novellas!

**How A Lass Weds a Highlander - Lecia Cornwall - 5 stars** - This novella is part of the ongoing Fairy Tales Series, this story is very loosely based on the Princess and the Pea. Cait is betrothed to Baird Sutherland, her distant cousin. When she realizes what kind of man he really is, she decides that she will not marry him - when he leaves to attack Alex's clan, she follows. Cait has no sense of direction and gets lost - she arrives after the raid and Alex takes her prisoner. Alex's clan believes that he must marry on midsummer eve or the clan will have bad luck. The legend is that the first laird fell in love with a fairy princess and when they wed, the fairy queen gave them a ring, which is affectionately called the pea, each new laird must put the pea on his loves finger at sunset or the clan will be cursed. Alex doesn't believe the legend and has no use for love - but he will marry for the clan's sake. When he arrives back from the raid with Cait, he finds that the potential brides have already arrived and the pea is missing! Cait tells Alex that she is the fearsome McLeod's daughter and asks him to send for her father. She proceeds to charm everyone, including the brides and especially Alex. Alex doesn't believe that she is McLeod's daughter and can't consider her as a bride. But the heart wants what the heart wants. When Alex decides on his bride, Baird shows up and it seems that all is lost. The novella is well written, flows well, has some surprises, betrayal and true love.

**A Match Made in Heather - Anna Harrington - 4 stars-** This is the story of Arabel and Garrick, ten years ago they were in love and planning to elope. Arabel tells Garrick that she cannot leave, that her family needs her, but won't tell him why. Garrick is a stable hand and believes that Arabel has changed her mind and is angry that she would choose her family over him. As he leaves he is ambushed and told that Arabel set him up. Ten years later, they meet again, Garrick has been awarded an Earldom for his service in the war and Arabel is engaged to marry and her family is basically in ruin. They learn that they have co-inherited her family's estate, but the terms of the will say that they have to live together in the house for 30 days, to refuse is to forfeit their claim. Nether is happy, but neither will back down and let the other win. Garrick wants revenge and Arabel - as they spend time together, they realize they were both wronged and old feelings haven't died. But can Garrick let go of the past? This was a well written, well paced novella, it had the hottest love scenes in the entire collection and had an emotional depth that surprised me. I assumed that I would dislike Garrick, because I dislike revenge plots - but in actuality, Arabel was the one I had a hard time liking. I didn't hate her - but I felt that she wanted everything her way and expected Garrick to just fall in line. She does redeem herself - but it was touch and go there for awhile...

**A Midsummer Wedding - May McGoldrick - 5 Stars** - This was my favorite in the collection. I loved Elizabeth and Alex! They have been betrothed for years and he has finally come to claim her - or has he? Elizabeth has no desire to marry the Highlander and along with the queen, concocts a plan to have him call off the wedding. When her plan goes awry, Alex must save her. They ended up stranded alone in a cottage and begin to realize how wrong they both were about the other and both regret their decision to call off the wedding. They come to a decision to wed and when they are rescued, it seems like they will get their HEA. However, team McGoldrick will not make it easy for them and Elizabeth have to make a heartbreaking decision to save her love. Excellent story, it is well written, has steamy love scenes, laugh out loud moments, tense moments and a soulmate type love. LOVED IT!!

**The Scot Says I Do - Sabrina York - 5 stars** - This was a close second for my favorite novella in this collection. Duncan and Catherine have known each other for years - he saved her life and she was besotted with him. Duncan was a stable hand on her father's estate and did all he could to discourage Cat's affection. When he disappears without a word, Cat is heartbroken and tries to convince herself that she hates him. Years later Duncan is back, he shows up at their London house and Cat is informed that her brother has lost the estate and Duncan has bought his debt. To save her brother from debtors prison, Duncan offers her an alternative, she can marry him. Cat is shocked to see Duncan again and can't believe the man who spurned her and was so mean to her, wants to marry her. She agrees to save her brother (that's her story and she is sticking to it). Cat has no idea what really happened all those years ago and has no idea that Duncan loves her and always has. This story is well written, has some of the funniest dialogue in the entire book, has steamy love scenes, great secondary characters, an twisted villain and a wonderful ending. This is loosely connected to the Untamed Highlander series and I sincerely hope Ms. York is planning on writing books for the St. Claire sisters!!

All in all, this was an excellent book, which I highly recommend!

So unusual that all 4 novellas in this book are 5 stars. I loved them all! I will not write too much as I do not like to spoil the stories.

Lecia Cornwall's "How a Lass Weds a Highlander" continues her standalone fairy tale novellas with a Princess and the Pea story. I have enjoyed all of them. According to legend, Alex Munro has 5 weeks to Midsummer's Eve to find, fall in love with and marry a bride with the fairy ring to restore the clan's luck, which has not been good lately. Cait MacLeod is sorry she thought her Sutherland cousin might be a good match for her and leaves his keep to go home. She gets lost in the woods, but found by the Munro who thinks she is an enemy Sutherland. So does Alex marry in time?

Anna Harrington's "A Match Made in Heather" may cause tears but is wonderful. Arabel loves Garrick, who works for her family. They plan to elope but she cancels due to family problems. He's furious she chose her family over him. Ten years later they find they have each inherited half of her Great Uncle's estate. They must share the estate for 6 months before either can sell their share. So do they settle their past?

May McGoldrick's "A Midsummer Wedding" has lowlander Elizabeth Hay facing a marriage arranged when she was a child to highlander Alexander Macpherson. She has waited long enough for him and wants to make him back out so she can do as she wants. She pretends to be someone else to meet him but a storm forces them together.

Sabrina York's "The Scot Says I Do" finds Catherine 's brother Peter trying to marry her off. But at 12 she fell in love with the family's groom, Duncan Mackay, who saved her life and then broke her young heart. What a coincidence that Peter now owes Duncan a large sum of money. Will the heart broken at 12 be able to heal and find a HEA?

Four of my favorite authors provided works for this anthology – so, it is only natural that I LOVE it.

HOW A LASS WED A HIGHLANDER by Lecia Cornwall

This tale is loosely (very loosely) based on the Princess and the Pea fairytale. Laird Alex Munro of Culmore

has to find a wife in five weeks or break a generations long pact. However, the 'Pea' is missing and they must have the 'Pea' which is the official engagement ring. Not only is the Pea missing, but the neighboring Laird has been attacking and burning the crofters on Munroe lands. After one such raid, Alex finds Cait MacLeod in the woods near the burned out cottage. Alex doesn't believe Cait's story and believes she is part of the raiding parties. Cait quickly wins the love of his Clan and even the potential brides who are visiting the keep – but – Alex is still wary of her. They have a long road to find their HEA, but it is a good read to get them there.

#### A MATCH MADE IN HEATHER by Anna Harrington

This is a story of second chances. Ten long years ago Arabel and Garrick were going to elope. Then, on the night of the elopement, Arabel tells Garrick that she cannot go because of a family situation that has just developed. Garrick is heartbroken and just doesn't understand why she always chooses her family over him. Then, when she thinks he has left her, she can't forgive him. There are huge misunderstandings in this story and you wonder how they can get past them. Given what happened to him, I would have thought Garrick would be the one unable to forgive, but it was Arabel who kept clinging to her hurt and anger. Frankly, she got on my last nerve, but finally came around so they got their HEA.

#### A MIDSUMMER WEDDING by May McGoldrick

I think this was my favorite story in the anthology. I LOVED the characters. They were well developed and fully formed, but I've never seen anything by McGoldrick that wasn't absolutely excellently done! Be prepared – there are some really giggle-worthy moments in this book! Elizabeth and Alex were betrothed as children and raised far apart, so they never met. Their lives were very different – she thought him a barbaric Highlander and he thought her a pampered, simpering, spoiled little princess. Both of them want out of the engagement, but the other doesn't know that. So, when Elizabeth tries to trick Alex into thinking she was in love with someone else so he'd break the engagement, things go really awry. They end up in the middle of a rain-swollen river fighting for their lives. It is funny how those near-death experiences bring you to being honest – and they were finally honest with each other and agreed to cancel the engagement. So – how do they get their HEA – well – you'll just have to read the anthology to find out.

#### THE SCOT SAYS I DO by Sabrina York

This was my second favorite of the stories in this anthology. I loved Catherine's friends, especially Elizabeth and hope to see their stories in the future. Duncan and Catherine were in love, but it was just not meant to be. She was the Lairds daughter and he was the stable hand – she was twelve and he was not. You have to wonder if there is any way for them to ever have a HEA. Years later, Catherine returns home from a ball to find that her brother has lost their entire estate – homes, land, money – all of it – and now that former stable hand owns it all. He also wants to marry her. Why in the world would he want to marry her now when he walked off and left her so long ago without even saying goodbye. I hope you'll read this delightful, funny and entertaining story to see how they finally get their HEA. There are twists and turns and even an evil dude – everything you could possibly want.

Legend has it that if Laird Alex Munro fails to wed by Midsummer's Eve, which is only five weeks away, he will die shortly thereafter, and bad luck will befall his clan. Nothing but bad luck has been happening due to his late father's negligence and incompetence. Also, the Sutherlands have been raiding them, stealing their crops, and destroying property. With the few men Alex has, he can't protect his clan the way he wants to. Though he doesn't believe in the legend, an alliance by marriage could benefit his clan, so four potential candidates arrive, intent on charming him and becoming his wife.

Cait MacLeod received a marriage proposal from her cousin, the laird of the Sutherland clan, and she fully intended to accept him. However, when she travels to his keep, she finds him a bully, and a cruel man who enjoys the destruction he causes. Cait ventures out and is captured by Alex, who believes her a Sutherland, despite her protestations that she is the powerful MacLeod's daughter. Alex sends a message to MacLeod, but in the meantime, he's keeping Cait as his guest.

Cait's sweet personality soon charms everyone, and even Alex is captivated by her. Though there are four potential brides clamoring for his attention, he only sees Cait. Alex is a decent, hard working man, but he never wanted love. Yet it seems to have found him. HOW A LASS WEDS A HIGHLANDER is a warm and romantic novella that has wonderful characters, a touch of magic, and a very satisfactory resolution that gives everyone their just deserts.

Garrick not only has to endure having his heart broken, but his body as well, since the estate agent was instructed to have him badly beaten before he leaves. It seems their secret romance was not to secret after all.

In the following ten years, there has been a reversal of fortune for both Arabel and Garrick. He became a soldier and a hero, and was awarded an earldom. But he didn't show, and as time passed, Elizabeth's dreams turned to dust. She became well educated, travelled with her father, and became a member of the queen's court. She hears stories of Alex's prowess as a ship commander and pirate. In *HOW A LASS WED A HIGHLANDER*, Lecia Cornwall gives delightful and whimsical twists to the classic fairytale *The Princess and the Pea*. Alex Munro's estate is in poor shape, mainly because of the Sutherland clans' raids. Legend has it that if he finds a bride within five weeks, his run of bad luck will be a thing of the past, if not, well Alex will be dead by November. Not much choice, is there? And poor Cait MacLeod is destined to marry one of those awful barbarians, trying to remedy the situation, she is mistaken for a Sutherland by the Munro clan and taken prisoner, but she manages to charm everyone, but will she capture Alex's heart? Does she ever! What a superb story, that would be flawless were it not for the unfortunately obligatory, and entirely unnecessary – and pages-long – sex scene. I felt it clashed with the lyricism and the tone of the story, which genuinely read like a fairytale: light, fresh, and so lovely.

Everything else is magnificent: the lush prose, the attention to detail, the crisp descriptions, the splendid secondary characters, the adorable Cait and the engaging Alex, and the spin on the pea is positively brilliant. Apart from the little stumble, this is a truly charming and enchanting tale. Lecia Cornwall has the magic

touch when it comes to fairytales.

Anna Harrington is next with her fabulous *A MATCH MADE IN HEATHER*. Garrick McGuiness and Arabel Rowland were madly in love, they had planned to elope, but family matters intruded; Garrick left, dejected, and Arabel was heartbroken. Ten years later, they are reunited under peculiar circumstances. They had not parted amicably, and time has not healed their wounds. This story is so emotional, and so meticulously crafted it felt more like a condensed novel than a novella. The characters are fully fleshed out, no detail is neglected, and we get the whole story behind the sorry mess. Ms. Harrington conveys Scottish pride as I have seldom seen, and there is a wonderful and completely unexpected moment when we feel the ice begin to melt between Garrick and Arabel; it was charming and felt completely genuine. This is a very beautifully written, engrossing grand love story that held me captive throughout.

*A MIDSUMMER WEDDING* by May McGoldrick is a marvellous, mesmerising, and enthralling story. In 1485 Scotland, Elizabeth May, a companion to Queen Margaret, was awaiting the man she would marry, sight unseen. Elizabeth and Alexander Macpherson had been betrothed when they were respectively three and seven years old. And Alexander is just as filled with dread as is Elizabeth. Neither had anticipated that the day they would wed would ever happen, and here they are. There is such a lovely, gentle touch to the prose, a refined elegance and wit, and yet the action scenes are breathtaking in their authenticity and impression of movement. There are so many twists and turns, most entirely unpredictable, and a most beautiful romance, I felt like clapping at times. Elizabeth and Alexander are two strong and very engaging characters, wonderfully different, and they make a perfect couple. I was so completely immersed in this story, that the outside world faded away for a while. The ending is dramatic and, as everything else in this story, absolute perfection.

The last novella is Sabrina York's *THE SCOT SAYS I DO*. Catherine Ross' brother Peter wants her to get married, Catherine wonders why the rush all of a sudden, until a blast from the past makes things crystal clear: Duncan Mackay. Peter has gambled everything the Ross family owns, and as Catherine and Peter are alone in the world, they are destitute, and Duncan, who bought Peter's vowels, proposes marriage to Catherine, which would solve everything. I must admit this story was problematic for me: Catherine and Duncan had met when Catherine was twelve years old, and Duncan a stable boy, he had saved her from drowning, and she was hopelessly infatuated with him. And Duncan had forever lusted after Catherine, and I thought it was creepy. Maybe it was a tad too historically accurate for me – but twelve! and Duncan's age was never mentioned – especially since Catherine describes her gorgeous Scot as a man. Eek. I also didn't quite understand why she was besotted with him, as it seemed he had teased her to the point of tears. In my book, looks aren't everything, but still. I also got the impression that this novella fit somewhere in a series, as I felt I should have known many secondary characters, which were marvellous, by the way. I thought there was too much happening in this novella, and not enough emphasis was put on creating some connection between Catherine and Duncan, beside a sexual one. On the other hand, they are a fine match because they are both consumed by lust; this was not a love story, but a lust story. And throughout, I could never shake the image of Duncan desiring a twelve year-old girl. I must say that I was really impressed by the quality of the writing, the choice vocabulary and the impeccable dialogues.

May McGoldrick, who are a writing team and were new to me, would have made this anthology a five-star read regardless of the other novellas because I was astonished by the charm that permeates the whole story, the magnificent period details, the cleverness of the plot; in short the utter perfection of *A MIDSUMMER WEDDING*.

Say Yes to the Scot: A Highland Wedding Box Set by Lecia Cornwall, Anna Harrington, May McGoldrick, Sabrina York is a 2017 Swerve publication.

The right historical romance combination at just the right time!

Some of my book buddies, and review or blog followers, have probably wondered why I have been reading far fewer historical romance novels this year.

There are many reasons, and I won't get into all of them here, but I have been on a romance novel diet, in general, for some months, but that is especially true for historical romance.

I am sorry to say, I never went through withdrawals, or developed uncontrollable cravings. Well, okay, I did a few times, but not for anything new. I have been reading older romances, here and there, but, maybe the 'everything in moderation' slogan applies to romance genres as well, at least for me.

However, I do have a massive pile of historical romance novels in my TBR pile, so I plucked this one out for several reasons, the main one being it was not a Regency. This collection of short stories is based around Scotland and I never seem to grow weary of Highlanders.

Also, the fact that this is an anthology also appealed to me because I wouldn't have to commit to a full length historical, meaning no rich, cholesterol laden meal. Instead, I could enjoy smaller portions, and still feel satisfied.

Every story featured in this anthology was good, but, for the sake of time, I am going to review only one of them:

#### A Match Made in Heather by Anna Harrington

This is the second story in the anthology and is centered around Arabel, the daughter of a laird and Garrick, who has no wealth, or title. The two fell in love, but were torn apart by family obligations and potential scandal.

Ten years later, the two are forced together again because of a most unusual will. But, Arabel is engaged to be married and Garrick is still holding hard to his resentments, determined to exact revenge for everything Arabel's family put him through.

I've always been a sucker for 'second chance at love' stories, so this one stood out from the others included in this anthology.

There is so much emotion, heartbreak, tension and suspense packed into this short story!! I was on the edge of my seat wondering if these two wonderful people, who were so obviously meant for one another, would be able to put the past behind them and make a future together.

I found myself completely immersed in the drama, angst and romance, which is something I have really struggled to experience in historical romance for a while now.

So, thankfully, this story reminded me that complete abstinence is not necessary and that it is okay to indulge in sweets once in a while without ruining your diet.

The first book featured in the collection, 'How a Lass Wed a Highlander' by Lecia Cornwall is my runner up. I love 'The Princess and the Pea', so I enjoyed this retelling of that classic.

Overall, this is a very solid collection of short stories/ novellas. As far as I can tell, none of these stories are connected to a series, all of them are stand-alone, and there are no sneaky reissues.

I enjoyed reading one story in between my other books, which gave me a chance to enjoy the genre in small doses, which is still working out better for me, I think. But, I also see myself slowly adding more historical romances back into the mix, especially if I can find some as wonderful as these are!!

It's been a while since I indulged in box sets or anthologies: it is simply a sheer volume/time required equation that with all I read and review, doesn't always work out. But, I love highlanders, have read titles from 2 of these 4 authors, and the premise with guaranteed HEA's after plenty of different issues sang out to me. Each story is unique in its premise: from debts to curses: each couple is put through a bit of a wringer before sense and love take over.

With two vying for a favored spot – the titles from Sabrina York and May McGoldrick impressed with the characterizations. While York's Catherine was a bit of a difficult miss to like – and prone to tantrums: but she does see some sense, eventually, and the kindness and all-around awesomeness of Duncan, along with the childhood crush the two shared did work it's magic. Now, McGoldrick's pair had plenty of intrigue, chemistry to boot, and Elizabeth who spends more time thinking about her future in the abstract rather than one with her betrothed, now worthy of her education, her beauty and her passion. Plenty of schemes to separate them with a knock heads against a wall recognition of their compatibility bring this story around nicely.

The other two: Cornwall's tale loosely based on the Princess and the Pea story brings the threat of a curse lest a wedding occur in weeks...unlike the original, however, the heroine Cait isn't some testy or pampered princess: daring, determined and bold, but with a horrible sense of direction and less ability to deceive, this story brings her to a new recognition of love, and fills the need for a wife, love and understanding that Alex needed – even if he's not sure of it all. Lastly is Harington's tale of lovers separated by circumstance and brought back together as part of a plan for revenge. There were a few too many conflicts and plots in this story: Arabel is conniving, spoilt and controlling where Garrick, now with an Earldom awarded after his war service and money in his pocket just seemed a bit too willing (even after plotting – halfheartedly – his revenge) to give in to Arabel's whims. While they seemed to be content in their relationship – I just couldn't buy in.

Overall – not a bad collection, and perfect for those who like one or two of the authors and are intrigued about another. That's the fun part about these collections – usually set with a common theme, you can dive in and discover new authors and find new stories to entertain.

I liked this one a lot! (4-5 Stars)
