This is forbidden romance at its best. It's taboo at its best! It takes passion to another level. It takes religion to another level. It is a story that might offend some and the author warns us of that fact.

Let's talk about the story first.

Honor Thomas is a good woman. She is kind, supports her mother, goes to church and is an active member of St. Cecilia's community. She is the one helping her mother, she does everything she can to become a social worker while working and volunteering.

Her world is upside down when Father Raphael enters her life.

I desired a priest, a holy man of God.

Father Raphael is a man of God. He is thirty years old, a handsome man, but he is devoted to his flock. He hides his own demons but he doesn't turn away from temptation. He faces it and denies it to the best of his ability.

He wants to lead his flock to salvation, but what happens when his own salvation is jeopardised?

Honor is what he shouldn't want. He can see her pain, and like her, he can feel their instant pull towards each other.

In you, I saw my damnation. It flashed like a prophecy in my mind...before it turned to fantasy.

The lust that sizzles between them is undeniable but so is their determination not to succumb to the burning fire that can lead their souls to hell.

Honor Thomas was my greatest temptation, but I was her darkest sin.

Will they give in to the passion or will they forever deny their feelings and part ways?

First of all, this book focuses on the Catholic faith, but I do believe that one can be a non believer in order to enjoy this. The book focuses on human strength, in my opinion.

We are met with a very confident, and at times arrogant priest, who believes that he can come face to face with the forbidden fruit and reject a taste. Raphael strongly believes that by making Honor face her darkest desire, he will be able to save her soul. His arrogance is palpable and I loved how Honor challenged him on this. She shed all his covers and blatantly informed him that all he wants is power over her; something that angers him but also something he doesn't deny.

Our priest rejects sex, but at the same time uses it as a weapon. This behavior had deep roots; his past wasn't easy and I was thrilled to see how the author handled that particular theme.

He was a confident man, without flinching or awkwardness.

Father Raphael didn't need the white collar or black cassock. When he spoke he earned respect. When he listened, he honored those speaking.

The book is very complex and the characters very, very complicated. It's unlike anything I've ever read. One minute I am in awe of the characters, and the other minute I am so frustrated!
