Honestly the first line of the blurb closely summarizes my feelings about the book: this is a fun, slightly sentimental, slightly saucy story that focuses on family, friendship and the little moments that are shared with those you love.

A bit slow in the start, with several scenes that didn't always seem to find a common thread, Cat is an engaging and enjoyable character: rather fractured and often overanalyzing her own life, like we all do. Fortunately, her sense of humor and ability to laugh at the repeated absurdities that we all encounter keep the story moving forward and entertaining.

Romance is also a highlight, with moments that use humor and the really silly things we all do in relationships taking a forward position to graphic sex and overwhelming angst. No particular great conflicts in this story, it is a fun and breezy uncomplicated read that entertains yet doesn't require a great deal of effort from the reader. While Cat is truly the best developed character, the secondary characters all exhibit traits and quirks that will be familiar to many readers, adding another layer of depth to the story while maintaining a level of comfort for the reader.

The Review:

I wanted so much to love this book. The story was refreshing and entertaining and the characters were lively and so much fun! I really enjoyed all the hilarious antics the girls squad got up to and the humiliating situations Catherine always found herself in. The last sixty pages were absolutely enjoyable and is what saved this from being a one star review or a “Did Not Finish” book for me.

My major problem with this read was all the inner monologue, overly descriptive explanations or scenes and all the extra “stuff” that was in each paragraph. I just wanted to get on with the story, to get to the center of the plot and see what happened next. There was so much “explaining” I actually found myself skipping over a lot of the sentences. I felt like I was speed reading through it because I was pulling the important words from each sentence so I could get the gist of the story without being bombarded with all the details.

I would love to see this story condensed down, all the unnecessary details and explanations edited out, put in a few more hilarious situations with the girls, have a few more actual “romantic” encounters with the hero and heroine so the ending “hook up” didn’t seem to come from nowhere and then re-released. I think this story could be a five star read instead of the 2.5 stars I’m giving it. I loved the idea. I loved the characters. I loved the situations.

I did not love everything being spelled out or all the descriptive or unnecessary background information that wasn’t relevant to the actual story. And I wanted more romance. There’s tons of potential here but sadly I felt it was poorly executed.
