Content/Scope: This 448 page atlas contains many features of traditional atlases, such as physical, climate,

and political maps. Satellite images of areas such as North America and Amsterdam are modern touches to enhance student learning.

Accuracy/Authority/Bias: Oxford University Press is associated with England's University of Oxford, founded in 1586. No bias can be seen; in fact, disputed borders around Russia are clearly marked as disputed, rather than having only one country's perceived border featured.

Arrangement/Presentation: The different maps are visually appealing and contain a great deal of information. Many additions to the contents result in an updated atlas with current information.

Relation to other works: Unlike traditional atlases, this book contains satellite images that can be used in conjunction with instruction on Google maps and to easily point out rivers and other geographical features that shape political borders.

Accessibility/Diversity: The atlas covers countries over a wide spectrum of political, religious, and social beliefs as well as ethnic backgrounds.
