Gemma Wells is about to find out how true that is after she tazers one of the town's citizens. She gets the choice of serving jail time and paying a huge fine or agreeing to work as the sheriff's office manager. The only problem is the vacancy hasn't been filled as the previous people who have held the job don't last long partially due to the high murder rate in the town.

It has been a little quiet lately and Gemma doesn't plan to stay very long in the town anyway so she might as well take the job. Too bad Jesse McCann and Cade Sinclair, mechanics in the town, think differently. They think she might fit into the town's high percentage of menage relationships just fine. And as she's been a lawyer in New York City she shouldn't have any stalkers, serial killers, or mafia crime lords to worry about...

Every single one of Sophie Oak's books from this series have been terrific. I usually feel that the previous one I read was my favorite until the next one comes out and then change my opinion that this one is my favorite. Well, this one is my new favorite. The central characters are well pitted against each other. Between the snarky interchanges and sexual tension I can't say enough about how much I loved this book. I laughed so many times reading this book as the characters have so many facets that if I lived there I would just park my chair at Stella's or on the main street and watch for hours on end absorbing the town's ambiance. The author has a special way of writing fun scenes that I know she had as much fun writing as I had reading. Additionally, she pulls in previous characters from the series and uses them as I would expect in a revolving chain of events that show this town is as close net protective as they are supportive. They interact and play off each other to enhance the story line but I always know who the central characters are. It's also admirable that new characters are given cameo's in such a way that I really don't know which one will be featured in the next installment. Keeps that 'who could it be' mystery alive for me. Yes, by now there's a central theme to the series but I will never get tired reading this series and would cry if it ever ended.

As to the sexual erotica. Not many authors can provide the mental picture descriptions like Sophie Oak can to get sucked into the written word scenes. The BDSM and kink are delicious and make me want to go to this town and abduct a man couple for my own forcing them to provide me with similar attention that the heroines in these books get. Well, it's Sophie Oak, it's Bliss, so you just know it's going to be good...and it is. More than a few quotes make up this review.

This time around the kinked up trio of MC's consists of Gemma Wells, a blackballed lawyer, previously from a high powered NY law firm, with an arsehole ex, what else? and the hot mechanics, Caleb Sinclair and Jesse McCann, introduced in Pure Bliss.

Caleb and Jesse are still working at Long Haired Roger's and have discovered that they fit right into the vibe of Bliss. Jesse rolls with it, Caleb fights it somewhat. Gemma turns up in Bliss with her mother, who has previously lived in Bliss and is recovering from cancer, and her mother's nurse, Naomi. She starts out working at Teeny and Marie's, then Stella's and, through a series of 'unfortunate incidents,' lands up working for Nathan Wright, at the Sheriffs office.

Of course the three MC's have their individual baggage, but I must say *Emo of the year* goes to Caleb (or Bare-Chested Ape Man as Gemma originally refers to him). Holy shit! he has a lot of *"I'm not good for her"* moments and inner monologue. Lots. Of. Them.

During one of his, lighter, introspective moments -

*"You look morose again." Jesse stared at him, a frown on his face. Great. Now he was Morose Bare-Chested Ape Man.*

Jesse is the talker here, he makes things happen by honest communication, irrespective of what it is. Perhaps asking about Gemma's ex, Patrick, during their first sexual encounter may have been a bit much, in my opinion, but he is nothing if not consistent. You have to love Jesse. His upbringing hasn't been perfect, he met Cade in a foster home, but he believes in getting words out there. Thank goodness, because Atlas-Complex Cade and Ice-Princess Gemma would never get together without Jesse as a conduit between them all.

Gemma doesn't believe in love, you can't plan it, people die on you, they hurt you, they do unpredictable things that don't fit into her whiteboard driven matrices of control. So, Gemma has big walls up and comes across as aloof and unapproachable. When she sees Jesse and Caleb, and realises there's a mutual attraction, she rationalises it -

*Maybe she could just play around. Not for forever. Forever was an idiot's dream. But she still had needs. Lots of dirty, filthy needs.*

Gemma had always been on a diet to fit into power suits and a lifestyle she had in Manhattan. My favourite activist, Nell, constantly visits Gemma now with pictures of people hurt in a case Gemma was previously involved in, to get her involved in the good fight, and, because it's Nell, to feed Gemma muffins -

*Cam snorted and reached for the muffin. Screw her diet. How many calories could it really be? It was vegan. "Get your own muffin-making stalker."*

Of course Jesse and Caleb are interested in a menage, that's how it's done in Bliss, and of course there's always someone else thinking about hitting on the pretty new woman in town -

*The last thing he needed was Ty trying to hit on Gemma. He doubted it would work. He was pretty sure Gemma was interested in what he and Cade had to offer, but he was a very straightlaced man. He believed in tradition and that meant no fourths.*

This is book #7 and Bliss is still going strong. Yes, it has a familiarity about the writing, but it is just right as there are always individual nuances to the MC's; and a little more is revealed about existing characters or added on. But mostly the family feel of Bliss is always wonderful - for a while you can be part of somewhere nice, where you are given a second chance, and people genuinely care for one another. There are a few more interesting characters touched on here that you just know are going to get books and the series will continue, so, yay.

A friend of mine, on GR, just recently gave a review where she liked the book a bit more because of the MC's name, Liam. I thought that was nice, to have that association. Well Purplegirl, I now feel like that about the name Cade. I loved Cade here, every time he was on the page my chest felt pressure and I wanted to either hug him, slap him or do something perhaps a bit more R rated to/with him. Angsty-Cade, who loves to feed his woman, as well as sex her senseless, is my kind of (fictional?) man. Plus, Jack Barnes gets a mention. If you've ever read my Texas Sirens reviews before you will know I'm happy dancing right now.

For the most part, I felt sorry for Gemma. She's this super hard worker. She possess ambition and her plan was sound. Her execution was even great. Unfortunately, her focus was off. So many stories are based on characters who have this issue. Sometimes it's a tired and used up device. Why is it so prevalent? Then I think about it some more and realize, it's a pretty accurate reflection of real life. So many people are this way. It's rather sad. So when it comes through a story like this and the fear turns around to acceptance, it gives me a warm fuzzy.

This is what Ms. Oak does for me. She gives me warm fuzzies and hope. This story is once again about hope and family. People who have hit rock bottom with nowhere to turn, they still have hope and it isn't some kind of entitlement welfare. Instead, it's real help in the form of friends and family. This type of bonding and small town support is quintessential to a Bliss series book. It's something I expect and every time, Ms. Oak delivers. I particularly enjoyed the "brotherhood" code of when a woman is "owned". It's rather old school yet makes my heart melt. I also like the women killer support group. That was pretty funny. "Hello, my name is xxx. I killed a man, but he deserved it! I feel guilty for taking a human life, but in my defense, he was a son of a bitch and the world is better off without him! I've been kill free for xxx months, xx days and xx hours." Well, the story didn't really go to that detail, but that is how I saw it in my head.

The romantic suspense in this story was actually quite believable. It's less far fetched than some of the other ones - like the Russian mobster hit. Every one worked together to solve this mystery and catch the villain. All my favourite cast of characters came to play. Sophie Oak has done it again-created a wonderful little world in Bliss, Colorado, and peopled it with unique characters that draw the reader right into town with them. Chasing Bliss is so entertaining that the few flaws are easily overlooked, and the book leaves you with a feeling all is right with the world.

Let's get the flaws out of the way first: one is why a woman as smart and driven as Gemma Wells would fall for her ex-fiance and go along with his schemes is a huge question. Second is the repetitive theme of the Bliss books: three wounded people come to Bliss, along with their problems, and set about creating a family with the help of the townspeople. This has been a reoccurring plot in the last several books. However, this one in particular is so funny and so introspective that you are willing to forgive.

Most of the book is laugh-out-loud funny. Sheriff Nate Wright's efforts to have Gemma work as his receptionist are hysterical. The townspeople, as usual, are charming in their offbeat ways and Gemma doesn't even realize how well she is fitting in with them, until a couple of the women spell it out for her.

In addition, the book is HOT. It is not overly full of sex, but the sessions that are there, will keep you needing some cold water or warm partner nearby. Gemma's two men, Cade and Jessie are great alpha males, taking charge in the bedroom, but letting Gemma be free to be herself elsewhere. Watching Cade overcome his demons is particularly poignant.

This is a great read from an author whose work continues to grow and shine with each new addition.
