The idea for my very first novel, *Neverending Beginnings*, came to me while I was painting. My husband and I had just renovated the first floor of a what used to be a parking garage. To save money we decided to do all the painting ourselves. It took forever, but somewhere around hour 500 of scooting along the floor painting baseboards the idea for a story about a woman whose best friend decided to marry her ex from college crept into my head. Shortly after that, in a writing workshop, I wrote the first and second chapters of the book that became the first version of this book titled, *The Year of Kate*.

An interesting fact about the book is that the *Groundhog Day* style repeating weeks were not added until the third revision. This (obviously) drastically changed the novel. Characters and entire plot lines were cut, stripping the story down to the most basic elements and really highlighting what I felt were the most important parts of Kate's journey. The reference to "neverending beginnings" was in the book before the re-write, but clearly became the most appropriate title for the novel in its new form.

My novella, *Delayed*, is linked to *Neverending Beginnings*. It picks up after the end of the novel and tells Kate's neighbor Carolyn's story, but readers get updates on Kate's life as well. To stay up to date on all my writing projects, stop by my website and sign up for my newsletter.

*Neverending Beginnings* by Mary Chris Escobar is a smart, witty novel filled with relatable characters and a very interesting situation. Our main character, Kate, is stuck living the week of her best friend's wedding over and over (*Groundhog Day* style). At first I was concerned I would become bored by seeing the same

events played out again and again, but I wasn't at all! Each repeated week was new and different as Kate learned from her mistakes and tried desperately to end the cycle.

Along the way Kate also happens to start falling for the best man, Ben, and it was thoroughly enjoyable to watch their romance blossom because Kate is so completely clueless in the beginning. Watching her realize her feelings over the course of the book while also getting to know Ben, who is both incredibly sweet and unmistakably manly, was one of my favorite parts.

This book is unlike others I have read. The book covers a one week time frame that repeats itself over and over again. Kate is the lead character. Her best friend Amy is marrying her ex-boyfriend Jack on the Saturday of that week. Kate has been roped into giving the wedding toast after Amy's sister backs out, because Amy wants a female toast along with the traditional one. Kate, who has drunk a lot during the reception, botches the toast, forgetting her notes, and is so embarrassed and sort of black out, waking up the next morning only to find herself back to the Sunday of the previous week, before the wedding occurred. The storyline is a bit creative, as I have not read anything quite like it before. In fact, I am not really a fan of time travel books. This one is intriguing, however, so I decided to try it. It was okay but I wondered whether it was worth my time when Kate ends up redoing this one week about the third or fourth time. I am not really sure what the author was trying to do, but, in my opinion, redoing a week again and again does not a great

storyline/plot make. I found there were differences in the way Kate lived each iteration of this week, but not that many so there was good continuity. During this week, Kate also is attracted to Jack's school friend Ben, who likewise is attracted to her, and a romance buds. However, after the third iteration of the same week, I began to wonder what the author's game plan was or whether this romance was going anywhere. There is good characterization, good chemistry between Ben and Kate, some great humorous episodes as well as some embarrassing ones, definite changes in what Kate does and how she behaves in each do-over. However, how many times does someone re-live the same week? And to what end? This was not very clear.

This is a fairly good book, except for this one thing. I enjoyed reading about Kate and her friends, even though the events, actions and words were sort of repeated again and again. Each time a little bit more about each was shown. It was interesting to see how the author took one week and changed just enough to make it different while keeping the week and all its activities about the same. I just could not wrap my head around why the week was repeated so many times.

This is a good book for anyone looking for a different sort of time travel book or a different sort of romance. The book reads easily, though drags a bit. The reader might be tempted to wonder what on earth the author is trying to show/prove, as not much in that way stands out. Still, it will probably be worth the effort for many. Mary Chris Escobar's comparison of her romantic comedy *Neverending Beginnings* to the movies *Groundhog Day* and *My Best Friend's Wedding* is spot on. *Groundhog Day* is one of my favorite movies of all time so I was excited to read this novel and it did not disappoint.

Imagine your best friend announces she's getting married after only dating her boyfriend for six months. Now imagine he's your ex-boyfriend. At the wedding, Kate has a few drinks too many at the bar before her bridesmaid speech. To make matters worse, she left her notes at the bar. Kate starts off by mentioning that Jack is her ex-boyfriend. She says a few other inappropriate things before she blacks out. When she wakes the next morning, she obviously regrets her actions. However, she soon realizes that the wedding isn't for another week...at least to everyone but her. She has the opportunity to make things right but first she has to relive the week before the wedding again, and again, and again...

"In a few days would I wake up hung-over from week one? Or did I drink so much that I died? Was this the afterlife? Was it hell? Like, literally, my own personal eternity of punishment?" (Kate, 53).

Kate's character is extremely relatable and she's someone that I think most people will root for. Jack's best man, Ben is as confused by the quickie wedding as Kate is, and they bond over that, among other things.

"The thing is part of me thinks this is all really fast and crazy but then there's this whole other side. Like when they started dating he was more excited than I think I have ever seen him," (Ben, 66).

"Really, isn't everything more exciting in the beginning?" (Kate, 66)

If you're a fan of romantic comedies, and if like me, you over-analyze situations and think "what if this had happened differently?" you'll love *Neverending Beginnings*.

On the surface, this is the story of Kate reliving the same stressful week of her life culminating in the wedding of her ex-boyfriend and currently somewhat estranged best friend. The summary offers a little more detail for the set-up but there is much more to the story beyond that.

In films, it's easy to skip over the repetitiveness of reliving a day (or several days) through a quick montage of images. That sort of visual fast-forward isn't available in a novel but Escobar does a great job of skimming over the parts that don't matter and focusing on what has changed from the week before. Every pass is a little bit different than the one before. And, as is true in life, even when Kate thinks she's figured out the "solution" events rarely turn out as she'd planned.

Aside from the main story of Kate trying to figure out how to set things right, there are subtler threads being woven throughout. There's Amy and Jack, who seem stressed out by more than just the wedding. There's Ben, who is so charming it's impossible not to fall for him, even if the odds seem stacked against Kate having a relationship with him. And then there's Kate's mother, who has passed away prior to the novel's opening but whose presence is still very much felt throughout. This was probably one of my favorite elements of the novel because I simply wasn't expecting it. *Neverending Beginnings* is a fluffy romance on the surface, but watching Kate deal with the loss of her mother, on top of the frustration of being trapped in this one week of her life, made her feel even more real to me, which made me more invested in what happened to her.

Don't come to this book looking for an explanation of how the time loop is started or what perpetuates it. *Groundhog Day* didn't have to explain all those details to tell a great story and neither does this novel. Come for the characters that you'll love and cheer for and for a story that takes you through frustration and maybe a few tears before bringing you to a brighter, hopeful ending. (And for those who know and love Richmond, you'll be cheering for every awesome location highlighted in the book.)

So okay, here's the thing: You should read this book to watch how the story unfolds inside an unconventional structure. And by unconventional structure, I mean it doesn't follow a linear path – it loops back on itself, repeating the same week over and over again, deepening a fateful set of circumstances surrounding a wedding.

How the story opens: Poor Kate Crenshaw. Not only does she flub-up a drunken toast at her best friend's September 19th wedding, her best friend is marrying her ex-boyfriend, Jack. Ugh. What's worse? Kate wakes up the next morning on September 13th – doomed to repeat a week of events.

“For a second, I let myself pretend that I didn't already know our ending. Pretend just once, for a few fleeting seconds, that our beginning never ended.” (p. 68)

There are many characters to follow, great storylines, and quite a few surprises. In fact, I was pleasantly surprised by how suspenseful the story was – considering the fact we were all reliving the same week over and over again. You'd think we'd know it all the second and third go around, but we don't. With each repeat (there are many), the story deepens, characters' story arcs are developed and ultimately resolved, and the main character evolves on her journey toward a resolution that wouldn't have been possible – had she not had the chance to examine her life in this way.
