It includes only the most common species, minimizing false ID's of the really rare species that are common among beginners. Sorted by color for fast field identification, includes multiple photos for different color morphs. Unfortunately there's generally only one photo per species, and no illustrations. There are a lot of species missing, and it will include many birds not necessarily present in your state so it's best to supplement it with a more in depth guide. However if all you're looking for is an introduction this is an excellent starter.

I began with this book, it helped me look at the birds in my environment a lot more closely, I augmented it with Petersons. Then I replaced it with Stan Tekiela's Birds of Massachusetts which has a similar color-based guide. But there may not be a Birds of... for your state.
