The story takes place less than a year after the Armistice and already society is changing, sometimes not for the better. Who else but an Army nurse who battled the Spanish flu would be strong enough to handle 50+ orphans and the director of the orphanage?

The chemistry between Dr. Parker and Ida was there at the beginning and just continued to develop toward the truly meaningful "I Love You"s and that first kiss. Ida enlivening the children's home with color that Daniel didn't realize was lacking was a great way to help her bridge the gap with the children. That said, while only a few of the 58 children were named (which made sense), it felt like some were named only for one scene, and I would have liked them explored a little more. The meddling done by Daniel's mother yielded appropriate results (not everyone has to have a nice, happy resolution). My only other qualm was that the two serious injuries in the book (one to Daniel, and one to the child Gitch) were fairly similar, and I thought more differentiation would have been nice.
