STORY 7/10

I'm a sucker for Cinderella-like stories. This manhwa is filled with a lot dramas and I'm not over-exaggerating it. It will leave you crying in the middle of the night. But sometimes, I think the plot is quite unbelievable. It's too much, I guess. You'll think that Jay is one damn unfortunate girl and Jarte is one hot psycho lover. The romantic scenes were the best—when they do sweet things, when they feel awkward, when they say cheesy lines. This is one of those series I'm slightly embarrassed to confess I enjoy. It's a pretty over-the-top romance, but I was looking for a new series to get into and was particularly drawn to this one due to Wann's art and the fact that this is a manhwa series. 100% Perfect Girl is essentially a 'cinderella story.' Jay Jim is a normal teenage girl from a working class family, struggling to find a way to make her dreams of becoming a professional artist (painter) come true. One day she (literally) crashes into J. Max, prince of a small foreign principality, and it's love (or obsession) at first sight. I might have given the story just three stars, but the artwork brought this one up to four stars. The story itself twists in bizarre and dramatic (or melodramatic) ways across the volumes, but I keep finding myself drawn to it nonetheless...

The fact that he's so earnest on his feelings and treats her like a princess, makes me want to smack her and get some sense into her head!

Like with all my reviews of manga/manhwa/manhua, this is a look at the series as a whole, rather than individual volumes, since the medium of drawing tends to mean that volumes are created based on number of pages/chapters rather than specific story arcs.

Warning now, I will be talking about plot points for the whole series in depth. This is not a spoiler free review, but an overhead view of the series after multiple reads over the years. This series contains heavy triggers and problematic content, which will be a bulk of what I discuss.

I even went back and read the first 7 volumes completely and skimmed the last 4. Trust me I got all I need to

know.

100% Perfect Girl is all about the romance between a Korean girl named Jae (in some translations it's written as "Jay" but Jae is how the Korean would be romanized) and the young king of a fictional European country, Roinne, named Jarte, who often goes by "J." The title (and the subsequent meeting of these two in the story) is based on the title and events of a short story by Haruki Murakami called On Seeing the 100% Perfect Girl on One Beautiful April Morning wherein a man recognizes a woman he passes on the street as being his ultimate ideal, but ultimately doesn't pursue the idea, leaving him wondering about the miss opportunity and about just what he would've said to her. Unlike the story, where the narrator simply speaks of the missed opportunity, J hunts down Jae in a grand romantic gesture "J is looking for J" on billboards and ads all over Korea and ends up running into her himself at one such billboard in a "it must be fate" sort of way that cements to him that they're meant to be. What ensues is a whirlwind romance where they date, fall in love, get engaged, go to his homeland of Roinne, and endure many, many, many ups and downs in their relationship as a result of Jarte being a rich, talented, handsome king who governs a powerful country with many enemies and expectations put upon him and Jae being a normal korean girl.

There's a lot to unpack about this series.

Let's get the easy stuff out of the way: the art style definitely strikes me as being Korean (their comics just have a certain LOOK) and is a little more... angular(?) than I've seen in a lot of comics. At times it's very beautiful, but there are times when the stylized faces or poses definitely look rather off. Like with most Korean manhwa, the style is an acquired taste lol. I personally like it a lot and appreciate its distinct elements, but I can see where the artist was either too reliant on style or not skilled enough to execute the pose/scene/etc. that they were attempting.

But what really kills this story is that its overly graphic and overly dramatic. It really wants to make Jae and Jarte have the most high stake relationship ever by throwing in kidnapping, deceit, insecurities, mental illness, trauma, murder, betrayal, dark distant pasts, attempted suicide, etc.... like this has a lot going on.

Jarte is abusive and awful. He's jealous, possessive, obsessive, controlling, mistrusting, quick to blame Jae and play victim, manipulative, and attempts to rape her like 5 times (no like for real there's several instances where he's like I CAN'T CONTROL MYSELF or I MUST HAVE YOU or WHY DID I WAIT I SHOULD'VE JUST FORCED YOU), even tries to KILL HER, all of which the story excuses. He's an emotionally insecure monster who expects the love of his life to sit happily in a well guarded room with 0 outside contact with the world, be ready for sex at a moment's notice, and be happy and emotionally attentive to him at all times. He seriously SUCKS and the comic tries to play it up as him being tortured and feeling intense and being so deeply in love, but he more or less is a man incapable of handling emotions who swings between extremes. He's even extremely jealous of his unborn child if they're a boy because he feels like a boy would compete with him for Jae's affections and when he knows that she's dealing with trauma he just yells at threatens her for not healing and accuses her of lying and not loving him and all this dumb, awful bullshit and I'm like, why is any of this seen as romantic it's nothing but red flags???

Jae is also like the ultimate wanted girl because every man she crosses paths with wants to possess her and have sex with her. She's constantly being harassed/assaulted by men. It's super disturbing because they all like her childish, youthful looks and helplessness and softness.

Overall, I see what the author was trying to do, but I think the attempt to make Jarte passionate and the world dark just ended up with everything being dark and unfortunate. I actually can't stand to read through volumes 8-11 because they're just more repetitive relationship drama nonsense to try to drag out the character

development to the last moment. The series comes off as repetitive with its conflicts and villains and ultimately could have been condensed if the characters hadn't been emotionally inept and written for the effect of drama and grit.

Not the worst series I've read but, it definitely suffers a lot for the plot choices made.

2 Main Protagonists:

*Mr. hornball Jarte Max Id'aregarde de la belle rionne III: Arrogant, emotionless, cold-hearted, HAWT. Future abusive husband. K-drama male protagonist.

*Jay Jin: slightly naive, beautiful, needs more common sense towards men. Artist (super cool!), high schooler. Not a complete airhead (yay!).

J. is a businessman and the prince of a tiny (yet prosperous!) European country. He is Korea on business when he runs into Jay, a lovely young art student (whose dreams are being quashed by her family and sexism). He is immediately smitten with her, and follows her into the countryside and away from his entourage of (eyecandy) caretakers. Jay and J. have a beautiful day together, up until J. is nearly killed by an allergic reaction to a chicken kebob (apparently, being a prince means one doesn't have to be aware of one's own medical history).

J. and Jay can't stop thinking about each other, despite not knowing anything about one another save for their names. J. begins a multimillion dollar advertising campaign to find Jay ("J is looking for J"), and returns to Korea three months after his near death-by-chicken experience. It is pure coincidence that reunites J. and Jay beneath one of J.'s giant billboard ads.

Friendship and romance bloom, and everything is sweet and sexy... up until the last chapter. J. was a bit of a jerk throughout the book, but it was also sweet to see him struggling with his feelings for Jay. Things take a darker turn when J. nearly rapes Jay (see: I love you so much, I can't help myself!) We get several pages of J. tearing off Jay's clothes as she cries and begs him to stop; when she questions his intentions towards her, J. turns huffy and tosses Jay out of his room, telling her that she'd misjudged him, and wronged him by doubting his feelings! No, you do *not* get to have hurt feelings after the woman you nearly *raped* has doubts about your honourable intentions!

The volume ends with J. showing up at Jay's home to propose marriage; is this meant to make up for the near rape?

The story and art were enjoyable up until the last chapter, but the sexual assault lost major points for the series.
