Philip has been looking for a bride for practical reasons: to care for his numerous younger brothers and sisters. But he is moved by the mysterious lady who is living with his elderly neighbors under what he suspects is an assumed name. He senses passion beneath Catherine's elusive manner and sets out to earn her trust and love. But their chance for happiness is soon threatened by a secret from her past.

This is the first in Elena Greene's Three Disgraces series, a regency about three young women who met in school and remained close friends despite family and social pressures. Lady Catherine, a duke's daughter, is lovely, spirited, and despised by her father and stepmother. After attempting to elope with a notorious rake (to escape from her cold, disdainful family), Lady Catherine is banished by her father to stay with her spinster aunts in Cumberland. Unless she marries the man of his choice - a wealthy marquess old enough to be her grandfather, Lady Catherine is exiled indefinitely to the lonely boredom of country life and forbidden to communicate with her friends or use her own name.

Catherine adjusts to country life and flourishes, befriending her aunts and enjoying the anonymity of being a plain "Miss" of genteel but undistinguished family. She falls in love with a neighboring gentleman farmer and truly blossoms in his loving company. But he doesn't know who she really is, or about her indiscreet past...

This is a warm, sweet quick read regency. I enjoyed it, but am not in rhapsodies or anything. I do like the characters of all three girls, as well as the dashing, semi-villainous Lord Verwood. I adore Philip Woodmere (our gentleman farmer). He is loving, protective and undaunted by Catherine or her family.
